Message from the President



Some wise man had once said being challenged in life is inevitable, being defeated is optional. The year 2020 has thrown mammoth obstacles at us in form of a pandemic that refuses to die down, a super cyclone Amphan that left the state devastated and economic downturn leaving the world crippled. So, the choice for The Cricket Association of Bengal was to give in and raise the hands in surrender, or fight it out, grafting, grinding with steely jawed determination not to give in to these dark times. We chose to fight back and are trying to overcome the challenges one after the other.

But the season 2019-20 did not begin bad at all. For it took CAB to greater heights. After his tenure at the CAB President with enormous success, Mr. Sourav Ganguly became the BCCI President from Bengal. The last President from Bengal was Late Mr. Jagmohan Dalmiya in 2001 and again in 2015. I take this opportunity to congratulate Mr. Ganguly on being elected uncontested. He has left behind a wealth of wisdom worth its legacy.

The CAB organised the first Pink Ball Test in India at Eden Gardens from November 22, 2019 against Bangladesh with grand success making it a world spectacle. It also marked the beginning of an era that saw packed houses in the evening with cricket lovers once again returning to the ground to watch Test cricket. It will not be out of place to recall that one August evening in 2016 the CAB actually held India's first ever Pink Ball D/N four-day match, which was the final of the CAB Super League.

I truly cherish the working relationship when Mr. Ganguly was the President and myself as the Secretary of CAB. Many positive works were undertaken like renovation of the indoor centre which was converted into a State of the Art Facility along with a Gymnasium and Swimming Pool.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the senior Bengal Team for their amazing run in the Ranji Trophy. Though we came second best, we gave enough proof of our guts and the wealth of talent that we have to take us to beyond the rope sooner than later.

My heartiest congratulations to the Team, Coach and the support staff involved in making this team a winning machine.

We had more good news with the U-23 emerging as the One Day Trophy Champions defeating Gujarat by 64 runs. The consistency that the Bengal U-23 team has shown over the last two seasons augurs well for Bengal as it also proves that we are on right track creating the right kind of supply line for the senior side.

The Women's team continued to make us proud doing consistently well during the season. Two players come for special mention here. Deepti Sharma for being the recipient of the Arjuna Award and Richa Ghosh for being selected for the National Women's Team in the Women's World T20.





The CAB had made adequate preparation for hosting the One-Dayer against South Africa on March 18, 2020, but the COVID arrived.

The pandemic has wrecked a havoc worldwide, but it did not deter us from doling out our responsibilities. With the support and diligent work of the office bearers and different committee members we made sure that the wheels of the Association turned smoothly.

Our work began immediately. We made sure that the SBI General Insurance obtained by the Association covered COVID 19. The CAB also made reasonable contribution to the State Corona Relief Fund in response to the appeal made by Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal, Ms. Mamata Banerjee.

Though there was complete lockdown and all association work was suspended, we were worried about our biggest treasures—our players, staff and of course our members. Online classes were arranged for the players and their dues cleared though the amount was still pending from BCCI. All pending dues of scorers, umpires and observers relating to the CAB matches held were also cleared.

The CAB put its head together to form a Standard Operating Procedure to slowly and steadily begin operations in a safe manner maintaining all Covid-19 protocols suggested by the BCCI and State Government.

The Association formed a Monitoring Group headed by CAB Vice President Naresh Ojha to oversee the implementation of COVID SOP. The CAB under its “Stay Safe Initiative” also decided to auto-renew the Annual, Associate and Life Membership for the season 2020-21 season keeping in mind the extraordinary circumstances created by the pandemic situation.

The players began gymnasium activities from September 10. Then we took the ambitious project of holding the Bengal T20 Challenge, an invitational meet featuring six teams. The 17-day meet was held behind closed doors under a bio-secure environment. 33 games, a bio-bubble with over 170 people and a tournament that went smooth as silk speaks highly of all the stakeholders.

We all expect Eden Gardens to get marquee matches in the ICC World T20 scheduled to be held next year in India. Preparations are afoot to give further facelift to the iconic venue with plans of setting up an Eden Museum. Among other exhibits, it will have statues of former opener Pankaj Roy, Sourav Ganguly, Jhulan Goswami and late BCCI and ICC president Jagmohan Dalmiya. The CAB wants to display items used by or associated with players who have excelled at India's most famous cricket ground. This museum is for fans who deserve it. We want to set up something which makes them come back. They can hold a bat or glove used during a famous innings and have a photo clicked. There will also be videos and audio recordings. Some of these will be permanent. Some will make room for others from time to time.

Besides this we will begin an Eden Gardens tour for tourists and take up the work to print a booklet on the iconic venue and our Association.

Before concluding, I must thank each and every one of the members for their kind cooperation and their unconditional passion for the Association. We sincerely hope that, together we would be able to achieve the targets and the milestones that we intend to achieve in the days ahead.

Secretary's Report



Respected Chairman, Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I would like to take this opportunity to extend a warm welcome to all of you to the 89th Annual General Meeting of The Cricket Association of Bengal. It gives me immense pleasure seeing you all here in these uncertain times when a pandemic has changed our lives, nay, forever. From the beginning of 2020 life has come to a standstill as COVID-19 has claimed lakhs of lives across the globe. Even we have lost many friends, kins and acquaintances in this period. But it has not deterred us from our sense of duty and commitment and as a responsible association we have shown our mettle in these trying times.

While, I feel extremely privileged to be able to serve the Association for the last few months, it is the players who make me immensely proud. You are aware that this year we had to stop all sporting activities midway through the season in the wake of pandemic COVID-19. Based on above, the Association decided to call off all 1st Division, 2nd Division and various Age Group / School / District / College Tournaments of 2019-2020 season including practice / training considering health and safety of the players and match officials. Furthermore, various precautionary measures like sanitization of kits, maintaining social distancing, use of disinfectant in office premises and toilets have been undertaken to avoid possibilities of any spread of Covid-19 after framing the guidelines in line of advisories, directives and norms issued by the Government(s). We have received immense support and cooperation from the members of the Association to implement the said guidelines in the larger interest of the cricket.

However, it is noteworthy to note that the Bengal squad (Men's & Women's) has made its presence significantly in the BCCI Tournaments during cricket season 2019- 2020. The Senior Bengal Squad (Men's) became Runners-Up in the Ranji Trophy and Under-23 Team (Men's) became the Champion in the Men's U-23 One Day Tournament: 2019-2020. Bengal Senior Women's Squad became Runners-Up in the Senior Women's Inter State T-20 Tournament : 2019-2020.

The cricket season 2019-20 was memorable and historic for The Cricket Association of Bengal as the iconic Eden Gardens hosted India's first-ever Day-Night Pink Ball Test between India and Bangladesh. On the occasion of this historic test match between India and Bangladesh, the Cricket Association of Bengal organized a function on 21st November, 2019 to celebrate the enriching relationship and cricketing history between Bangladesh and Bengal. The celebration was graced by Madam Sheikh Hasina, Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh as Chief Guest. The event was attended by the cricket teams of both the countries, past cricketers,



cricket administrators, senior government officials and other dignitaries. It may not be out of place to mention here that the Bangladesh cricket team played its first ever test match, and it was against India, in November 2000 at the Bangabandhu National Stadium in Dhaka. On 22nd November, 2019 Madam Sheikh Hasina, Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh rang the bell just before start of the first Pink Ball Test Match. After first day's play, a felicitation programme was held where Hon'ble Prime Minister of Bangladesh and Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal and past players from both countries along with some of the leading sporting figures from India were felicitated. Thereafter, a Cultural Programme involving Indo-Bangladesh artistes was held followed by High Tea.

The Cricket Association of Bengal felicitated newly elected President of BCCI, Shri Sourav Ganguly on 25th October, 2019 at Dr. B. C. Roy Club House, Eden Gardens. At a gala function cricketers, past and present, braved the downpour to attend the function to listen to the vision of the President. He walked up the stage flanked by his first India Captain, Md. Azharuddin and V V S Laxman amidst thunderous applause and roaring reception. He was felicitated with a bouquet of flowers, a silver plaque and a decorated turban by the CAB officials. Then Bengal men's and women's captain, Abhimanyu Easwaran and Paromita Roy felicitated him. Former cricketers like Brian Lara, Kevin Pietersen, Graeme Smith, Virender Sehwag, Harbhajan Singh, Gautam Gambhir and Irfan Pathan also sent their good wishes to Sourav Ganguly via video message.

This year the Association introduced a New Membership Scheme named Special Membership for a period of 5 years @ Rs.2,50,000/-. The offer of the new scheme included a dedicated stand meant L Block in the Eden Gardens Stadium which was reserved for the special members and entire L Block would be upgraded with new seats and facilities. All special members entitled to get one match ticket for all International and Indian Premier League games held at Eden Gardens. The tenure of this Special Membership started from 1st January, 2020 till 31st December, 2024. A dedicated hospitality area would be developed under the L Block for exclusive use by Special members on match days. This area will provide high quality food and beverage service on payment basis for each game.

Before we proceed with the detailed report, we have the sacred duty to remember those personalities who have left for their heavenly abode, but had rendered invaluable services to the game of cricket.

Homage



Pranab Mukherjee

The 13th President of India left for heavenly abode on 31st August 2020 at the age of 84. He was President of India from 2012 until 2017. In a political career spanning five decades, he was a senior leader in the Indian National Congress and occupied several ministerial portfolios in the Government of India. He adorned several ministerial portfolios as Minister of Finance (2009-2012), Minister of Defence (2004-2006), Minister of External Affairs (2006-2009) and Minister of Commerce and Industry. He was awarded India's highest civilian honour, the Bharat Ratna in 2019. He was very well respected within the party social circles. The Govt. of India announced a seven-day period of state mourning between 31st August and 6th September whereby the national flag remained half mast.



Kousik Saha

The current Scorer of the Association as well as BCCI left for heavenly abode on 17th January 2020 at the age of 51.

Arup Chatterjee

The former Hony. Asst. Secretary (2005-06) left for heavenly abode on 16th March, 2020 at the age of 73 at Kolkata. He had served the Association as Member of different Sub-Committees from time to time. He was an amiable personality and loved by all.

Pradip Kumar Banerjee

Pradip Kumar Banerjee or PK as he was called in the Maidan left for heavenly abode at the age of 83 on March 20, 2020. With him football lost forever its favourite striker. Two Olympics (Melbourne 1956, Rome 1960), three Asian Games (1958, 1962 & 1966), Gold Medal as a player and Bronze as a Coach (Bangkok 1970) in his first big tournament, his credentials remain unmatched and are unlikely to be emulated. PK was not just a player but a character who epitomized everything that Bengalis loved over the years. He was such an integral part of Bengal life and sports culture that Kabir Suman, the man who brought about a renaissance in Bengali Music in the early 1990s, through his unforgettable number 'Ei Shohor Jane Amar Porthom Sobkichu' (This city knows my every firsts) had a couple of lines appropriate for a player of such caliber.

One of the greatest Indian footballers, who dazzled as a player in the 60s and was probably the most sought-after coach during the 70s and 80s in Kolkata Maidan, PK is an enduring love story that will not end even in his death. He was perhaps the first Football Manager, when this part of the world had not heard of this term. His vocal tonic will forever remain as an astute example of reading a game's psychology and impeccable man management.

He will remain synonymous with good football, great stories and part of a fabled troika he formed with Chuni Goswami and Tulsidas Balaram.





Subhas Kundu

The former Vice President of the Association and Hony. Secretary of Hooghly District Sports Association, an affiliated unit of the Association passed away on 23rd March, 2020 at the age of 63. He also served the Association as Vice President during 2012-13 & 2013-14 as well as Member of different Sub-Committees from time to time.

Gautam Sur

The current Asst. Curator passed away on 19th April, 2020 at the age of 61. He had served the Association as Curator for a long time.

Sushanta Ghosh

The retired umpire of the Association left for heavenly abode on 21st April 2020 at the age of 61. He was Coaching with Paikpara Sporting Club, a First Division Club.

Subimal (Chuni) Goswami

Subimal Goswami or 'Chuni da' as he was called lovingly, left for the heavenly abode on April 30, 2020 at the age of 82. With his passing the last Mohican of Indian Sports departed. Legend has it that when Goswami announced his international retirement from football in Mumbai, two special fans met him and requested him to change his decision. The two gentlemen in question were Dilip Kumar and Pran - who would not miss a match at the Cooperage if Goswami was playing. It was his greatness that he quit football at 30 and then pursued cricket, another sport he was passionate about. He went on to Captain Bengal in Ranji Trophy Final in 1972. History has it how Goswami would enthral the Brabourne Stadium crowd by juggling a cricket ball during breaks of that Ranji Final. He took a match haul of eight wickets for combined zonal team against Gary Sobers' West Indies team during a tour match in 1967. During that match, Goswami back-pedalled 25 yards to take a catch that earned plaudits from Sobers, who termed it as exceptional from a cricketer from sub-continent. Born in Kishoreganj District of undivided Bengal, which is now in Bangladesh, the striker played 50 international matches between 1956 and 1964, including the 1960 Olympics in Rome. Besides captaining India to the Asian Games Gold medal in 1962, he was also a part of the silver-winning team in the 1964 Asia Cup in Israel, which remains the country's best performance in the continental showpiece till date.

As a cricketer, he represented Bengal in 46 first-class games between 1962 and 1973.

Goswami, PK Banerjee, who also died recently, and Tulsidas Balaram formed a deadly forward-line during the 'Golden Era' of Indian football when the country was considered one of the Asian powerhouses. Goswami won the Best Striker of Asia Award in 1962. For his service to Indian football, he was conferred with Arjuna Award (1963) and Padma Shri (1983).

Subroto Sarkar

The Chairman of previous Tournament Sub-Committee and current Tour, Fixtures and Technical Committee of the Association expired on 20th May 2020 at the age of 68.

Avik Basu

The current probationer umpire of the Association passed away on 14th July 2020 at the age

C.A.B. Junior (Under-18 Years) Invitational Cricket Tournament

The League stage of CAB Junior (Under-18) Invitational Cricket Tournament partially completed but called off due to COVID-19 pandemic.

C.A.B. Junior Cricket (Under-15 Years) Tournament

Inter School Cricket Tournament (Under-15 Years) jointly organized by CAB & KMC in association with KKR

With the fund of Rs.20 lacs from Kolkata Knight Riders the Inter School Cricket Tournament (Under-15) named as 'Mayor's Cup' was organized. This year 140 matches in the first phase were completed where total 70 teams divided into 14 groups consisting of 5 teams. 14 teams were promoted to 2nd phase and only 20 matches were finished out of 42 matches in the 2nd phase (two days match). Rest matches were not held in the wake of pandemic.

Note: Cooch Behar District Sports Association has been debarred from participation or to conduct all the Tournaments and Coaching Programme of this Association till the finalization of their court case.

Inter District Senior Tournament (1 Day Match): The First Phase Matches of the Inter District Senior Tournament were held at Nadia, Siliguri, Malda, D. Dinajpur, 24-Pgs (South) and Murshidabad and Second Phase Matches could not be started for imposition of lock down due to COVID-19 pandemic.

Inter District Under-19 Tournament (2 Days Match): The First Phase Matches of the said Tournament were held at Nadia, Cooch Behar, Birbhum, D. Dinajpur, Manbhum and Hooghly. The Phase-I matches could not be completed because of COVID-19 pandemic.

Inter District Under-16 Tournament (1 Day Match): The First Phase Matches of the said Tournament were held at Uttar Dinajpur, Murshidabad, Bankura and Midnapore. The First Phase matches

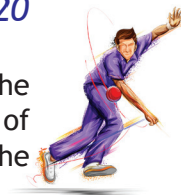

Sub-Division School (Under-15) Tournament: This year, the District Sports Associations were unable to complete the Sub-Division (Under-15) School Tournament (League-cum-Knock Out) in the wake of outbreak of COVID-19 except Uttar Dinajpur District Sports Association. 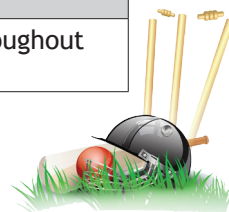

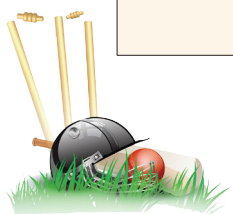

Total eight universities were divided into two groups of which Group-A comprised of Kalyani University, Burdwan University, Jadavpur University and Rabindra Bharati University and Group-B comprised of Calcutta University, Visva Bharati, Technology Students Gymkhana and North Bengal University. The Burdwan University hosted Group-A matches including 1st Semi-Final and Final and Visva Bharati hosted Group-B matches including 2nd Semi-Final at its two grounds. The Semi-Final and Final were of two days duration. Burdwan University became the Champion by defeating Kalyani University in the Final.

Burdwan University: Burdwan University participated in the East Zone Inter University Cricket (Men) Tournament but the tournament was postponed arising out of COVID-19 pandemic.

This year Burdwan University hosted all Group-A matches including 2nd Semi-Final and Final pertaining to the Ajoy Ghosh Memorial Trophy Tournament : 2019-20 and Burdwan University became Champion by defeating Kalyani University in the Final.

Burdwan University team also participated in the Inter University T - 20 Cricket Tournament held at I.I.T. Campus ground at Kharagpur and lost in their 1st Match against Kalyani University.

Calcutta University: This year, Calcutta University Cricket Team participated in Ajoy Ghosh Memorial Trophy Tournament and lost to Burdwan University in the Semi-Final match.

Apart this, Calcutta University Cricket Team became Winner in Inter University T-20 Tournament held at IIT, Kharagpur amongst its 8 nos. affiliated Universities.

The University also took part in East Zone Inter University (Men & Women) Cricket Championship 2019-2020 but the tournament called off due to COVID-19 pandemic.

The University Cricket Team participated in the Ajoy Ghosh Memorial Trophy Tournament organized by this Association which was held at Burdwan University Ground (Group-A matches) and became Runners Up.

The University Cricket Team also participated in the Inter University T - 20 Tournament run by this Association which was held at IIT, Kharagpur Campus ground and reached at Semi Final.

The University also participated in the East Zone Inter University Tournament.

North Bengal University: The University Cricket Team took part in the Ajoy Ghosh Memorial Trophy Tournament at Visva Bharati, Santiniketan run by this Association and lost in the Group Stage match. Also, participated in the Inter University T-20 Cricket Tournament at IIT, Kharagpur.

The Sports Board, NBU had conducted the Selection Trial for the Inter University Tournaments on 26th and 27th September, 2019 at the University Cricket ground.

Inter College Tournament : The Kiran Chandra Memorial Inter College Cricket Tournament for the year 2019-2020 was organized by Sports Board, NBU from 18th to 27th February, 2020 at University Campus ground. 20 Colleges took part in the said Tournament. Ananda Chandra College has won the Champion Trophy beating Siliguri College of Commerce in the Final.

Technology Students' Gymkhana: This year, Technology Students' Gymkhana, IIT, Kharagpur had organized all the Matches of Inter University T-20 Trophy Tournament at their two grounds at Kharagpur. All matches except Final were held under lights.

Apart from that, the Technology Students' Gymkhana also participated in other University level matches.

Visva Bharati: This year, Visva Bharati Cricket Team participated in Rohinton Baria Trophy - East Zone Inter University Cricket Tournament.

Also, Visva Bharati hosted Group-B league matches along with 2nd Semi Final of Ajoy Ghosh Memorial Cricket Tournament at its two grounds. Visva Bharati along with Calcutta University, North Bengal University, Technology Student Gymkhana and Burdwan University took part in this tournament.





Office Sports Federation

The Federation could not conduct the Inter Office Cricket League and Knock-Out Tournament in the Cricket season 2019-2020 due to imposition of lock down arising out of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Umpiring

The initial goal of this newly formed Umpires' Committee was to extend all possible positive efforts to run it smoothly. For this reason, before and during the season, the umpire's classes were conducted on a regular basis, with the motto to make the umpires well conversant with the MCC Bye Laws and Tournament Bye Laws. To review the situation, the Association kept a regular visit to the match days in all the Divisions and also stood by with the field umpires during the matches. This made the umpires more confident. A fair numbers of junior umpires, who were doing well, were posted in the 1st Division important matches and returned with flying colours. They considered to be the future of our Association, if nurtured them correctly. The senior umpires also did an excellent job.

It was unfortunate that due to unprecedented COVID-19 situation, the tournaments could not be finished. It is hoped that this committee will also perform successfully.

Observer

The Match Observers carried out their jobs in the 1st & 2nd Division League Tournament : 2019-2020 though the tournament called off in pandemic situation. The Association conducted the Observer classes in order to updating and 86 observer had appeared for the same. The Association also conducted written examination for new observers on 29th January and 31st January, 2020 where 113 candidates had appeared. 40 new observers were selected for viva voce test but the same could not be held due to pandemic.

Moreover, some players and officials were cautioned on the basis of Observer's report.

The Association had taken appropriate action including suspension of players and officials of the clubs who misbehaved with the umpires as identified in the reports of Match Observers. This year posting of Match Observers were done in a systematic manner and the Sub-Committee found no problems in posting the observers.

Scoring

This year posting of scoring was done in a systemic way so that no complaint was received about posting of scorers. Scorers attended the ground in time and no major mistakes were found in scoring. Extensive classes and Scorers Workshop cum examination to recruit new Scorers were held from 21st February to 23rd February, 2020 and 26 scorers were qualified out of 102 candidates.

Bengal Cricket Academy

This year Bengal Cricket Academy, Kalyani hosted 6 nos. CAB 1st Division matches under Group-A. In addition, one Ranji Trophy match between Bengal and Hyderabad held on January 19-22, 2020, two Col. C. K. Nayadu Trophy matches (Manipur Vs Nagaland and Manipur Vs Pondicherry) during December 2019, three Cooch Behar Trophy matches (Bengal Vs Haryana, Bengal Vs U.P. and Bengal Vs Punjab) during Nov.-Dec., 2019 and three Vijay Merchant Trophy matches (Manipur Vs Mizoram, Bengal Vs Tripura and Manipur Vs Arunachal Pradesh) during October, 2019 were held successfully at BCA, Kalyani.



Ground

The temple of cricket Eden Gardens hosted the first ever Day-Night Pink Ball Test between India and Bangladesh on 22nd - 26th November, 2019. It was an immensely successful affair which got global cricket's attention. The iconic Eden Gardens was scheduled to host the 3rd One Day International match (D/N) between India and South Africa on 18th March, 2020 but the said match was called off due to COVID-19 pandemic. The Eden Gardens was ready to host the IPL matches but the said tournament was shifted from India due to the ongoing pandemic situation.

After quite a few years Ranji Trophy semi-final was played at Eden Gardens between Bengal and Karnataka from 29th February to 4th March, 2020. The match was competitive and everyone praised the wickets and ground conditions. The Association is very much thankful to the ground staff who have worked tirelessly throughout the year to keep the ground at par with the International standards and received accolades from cricket fraternity.

This year four (4) additional curators were appointed to keep a strict vigil and monitoring the ground preparations. They were instructed to submit the reports about the ground conditions to the Association from time to time. The Ground Sub-Committee members of the Association also inspected the grounds. A series of meetings were held in the Association for development of grounds and refresher courses held on requirements of soil. Accordingly, soil was delivered to the grounds for preparing pitches to ensure that the grounds were ready before commencement of cricket season 2020-21. The Association also looked to upgrade the infrastructure of grounds.

Like earlier, several Board matches were played at the Eden Gardens, Jadavpur University 2nd Campus Ground, Salt Lake and Bengal Cricket Academy, Kalyani.

The Association took full responsibility for preparations and maintenance of P & T ground, Federation ground in addition to the Deshbandhu Park (Oval), Aditya Cricket Academy and Bangabasi Ground at its own cost for CAB Tournaments and Office League matches.

The Ground sub-committee at one point of time successfully conducted matches at several grounds including CC&FC, Balurghat Ground, Railway Stadium at James Long Sarani, Videocon Twentytwo Yards and Kharagpur Sersa Grounds in addition to the ones mentioned before.

The Ground Sub-Committee also conducted matches of 1st & 2nd division league : 2019-2020 before called off the domestic tournaments due to COVID-19 pandemic.

The affiliated Districts also received the requisite aids for preparation of grounds.

Transfer

This year the Sub-Committee unanimously decided in its meeting held on 12/08/2020 to defer the window for transfer of its players in view of the prevailing COVID-19 pandemic situation and also decided to defer the transfer window for the time being considering the protocols imposed by the Central and State Governments. The President and the Hony. Secretary of the Association will together monitor the situation on a fortnightly basis and take appropriate measures to have the transfer exercises done when the restrictions are relaxed.

Apart from the above the Association would introduce biometrics and digital signatures of the players from the season 2021-2022 and would set up an age verification cell to curb the age fudging menace.

Coaching

The Association conducted extensive coaching activities for its Under-19, Under-23 and Senior Bengal Squad as well as Senior and Junior Women Cricketers. The nets were held under the guidance of the following Coaches :

Selection Trial

The Cricket Association of Bengal conducted Selection / Match Trial for Bengal U-23 Women's Squad at Dubrajpur, Suri from 3rd to 5th November, 2019.

Cricket

This year, the Cricket Committee of this Association comprising of Senior Tournament Committee and Tour, Fixture & Technical Committee took an unique steps in order to enhance competitiveness in the Second Division League Tournament. The 57 second division clubs have been divided in 4 groups (A,B,C & D) with 9 teams each and rest 21 clubs have been divided in 2 groups (E & F) with group E having 11 teams and group F having 10 teams. After the first phase of league matches, bottom ranked 4 teams of group-A,B,C & D (one team from each of the 4 groups) would be placed in group-E & F in the next season and top ranked 4 teams of group E & F would be placed in group-A,B,C & D in the next season. All the matches shall be of two days duration.

This year in view of the evolving situation on the spread of Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19), the Association decided to call off all 1st Division, 2nd Division and various Age Group Tournaments of 2019-2020 season conducted by CAB considering health and safety of the players and match officings. Furthermore, various training programmes undertaken by the Association had been cancelled as a precautionary measure against ongoing Corona Virus outbreak. The Association considered to refrain from engaging in any cricket activities and training programmes at present till thorough guidelines are framed by it.

Like earlier years, the Cricket Committee took some stern steps to maintain the spirit of cricket. After scrutinizing the Match Observer reports and records lying with the association, the committee cautioned the cricketers of different age groups on account of either misbehaved with umpires or production of forged birth certificate at the Association.

Medical

This year, the Medical Unit has played an important and significant role in rendering services for Board matches as well as Domestic Tournaments. The Medical unit arranged to distribute emergency medical kits along with Ice Pack (2 pkts.) as well as provide ambulance to all 1st & 2nd division teams for proper medical care of injured players. Not only clubs, the Medical Unit also ensured that the medical kits are delivered to all grounds before start of the match relating to Inter School Tournament, CAB Ambar Roy Sub-Junior (U-13) Cricket Tournament, CAB Junior (U-15) Cricket Tournament and CAB Junior (U-18) Invitational Cricket Tournament. With the efforts of Medical Unit, the Association had tied up with some reputed hospitals of Kolkata for medical treatment.





In addition, the Medical Unit extended whole hearted support to officials, scorers, observers and umpires of the Association during the period of COVID-19 pandemic. The Medical Unit negotiated with the Insurance Co. to bring the players, umpires and scorers under the Corona treatment coverage. The Association has been sanitizing from the beginning of the pandemic under the supervision of Medical Unit's Chairman.

In a joint bid with other departments of the Association, Medical Unit has played a vital role in this year while the South Africa Cricket Team used Kolkata as their transit route of return, after the abandoned series, by providing the visitors all needed medical and health care assistance.

Medical Sub-Committee in association with the members of Monitoring Committee and Task Force both the bodies headed by Vice President of the Association, Shri Naresh Ojha has taken the pivotal role in preparing and upgrading the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for resumption of cricketing activities amidst the pandemic situation.

Statistical

The Statistical section has been continuing endeavour to upgrade its record keeping with different programmes and packages in order to have any information at a glance. Respective datas for all tournaments and individual performances were compiled in order to ensure availability of any information. The required Documents of players related to cricket have been uploaded in the Computer for future references. Further improvement of this section has been a continuing process and the Association left no stone unturned to keep pace with the modern techniques.

Tour

The Bengal Team of different age groups (Men & Women) played some preparatory-cum-warm up matches in other states to hone their skills as part of the pre-season preparations ahead of season 2019-20. All tours were well organized and hasselfree. U-19 Women's team played practice match at Andhra Pradesh from 13th to 27th September, 2019. The Sr. Women's Team toured Baroda from 12th September to 1st October, 2019. The Senior Bengal Men's Team took part in the camp at Jaipur and played some practice matches at Jaipur from 3rd September, 2019. U-16 Bengal Men's Team practice matches at Bilaspur and Una. Bengal U-19 Men's players played practice matches at Himachal Pradesh on 8th - 29th September, 2019. The CAB XI team comprising mostly U-23 players played practice matches at Himachal Pradesh from 17th September to 1st October, 2019.

Moreover, CAB XI U-19 Team participated in the Popular Cup followed by RVVK Prasad Cup played at Mulapadu, A.P from 26th July, 2019 and the CAB XI Women's players participated in the 2nd Late H.H. Madhavrao Schindia All India Women's Limited Overs Tournament at Gwalior on 7th - 11th September, 2019.

Apart from the above, the travel arrangements for the Ranji Trophy Team & Womens' Team of Bengal also went off smoothly.



Seminar

In order to develop the overall standard of cricket in our State, the Association conducted various types of Workshop for betterment of cricket :

First & CPR Orientation Programme for Sports People

Like last year, the Association conducted in collaboration with Life Saving Society of India the First Aid & CPR Orientation programme started on 13th August, 14th August, 16th August and 17th August, 2019 at Dr. B. C. Roy Club House, Eden Gardens, Kolkata among the Observers, Umpires, Scorers, Coaches, Players and other Field Staff batchwise to create more nos. of knowledgeable First Responders during practice session or a tournament resulting in reduction of fatalities on the playing field.

BCCI Anti-Corruption, Anti-Doping & Age Verification Education Programme 2019

The Cricket Association of Bengal conducted the aforesaid programme on 25th August, 2019 at Dr. B. C. Roy Club House, Eden Gardens, Kolkata among the players and support staff in two sessions to explain the processes and clarify doubts for the Age Verification Programme. Faculties from BCCI were Dr. Abhijit Salvi for Anti-Doping programme and Mr. Dheeraj Malhotra for Anti-Corruption education.



Curators' Workshop

The Cricket Association of Bengal organized a Curator's course to train the curators with the latest information and technique of maintaining the grounds. The course was also attended by Mr. Humayun Kabir and Mr. Hossain Fakir from Bangladesh Cricket Association. The course cover pitch soil, onfield practical course, equipment operation and maintenance, pitch preparation etc. The course was conducted in the presence of Mr. Ashis Kr. Bhowmick, BCCI Curator and Mr. Sujan Mukherjee, CAB Curator.

Scorers' Workshop

The Cricket Association of Bengal organized a Workshop for Scorers on 21st and 22nd September, 2019 at Eden Gardens. The scorers learnt latest information regarding various scoring aspects and experienced through video clippings. Mr. Koushik Saha and Mr. Ananda Das conducted the workshop.

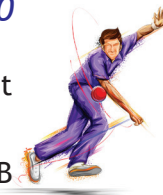
Library - News Letter

Cricket being followed like a religion in the state requires regular and consistent information and the same was provided by the media cell. The cell not only did an exemplary work of keeping a steady flow of information available for the media and cricket fans, but also during the pandemic the cell worked overtime to make sure all online training informations, state association informations and other important developments were regularly sent to the media. In addition, the cell made sure that the social media pages on Facebook and Twitter kept buzzing with announcements and information.

This apart the cell made sure that the news section of the website was regularly updated with all cricketing informations so that people saw a busy updated website of CAB.

The Association pursued to update regularly with current affairs of cricket, scoring of domestic cricket matches as well as Board matches, major events of the Association etc. on the Association's website. Individual milestone, Group achievements also featured on the website to fa-





entertain the viewers. It was also monitored regularly by the professional persons to ensure that the important matters are highlighted.

The Association also published Newsletter from time to time featuring glorious moments of CAB as well as individual's achievements & noteworthy contributions to the Bengal cricket.

Stadium

There was no major jobs / replacement works / repairing jobs conducted at the Stadium except little essential job. The normal maintenance work of the Stadium was carried out throughout the year by various agencies appointed by the Association.

Infrastructure Development

The Association has completed the renovation jobs of Pankaj Gupta Indoor Coaching Centre of CAB comprising of well equipped gymnasium, swimming pool etc. to facilitate better training and practice of the players. In addition, the Association set up a Conference Room next to the said Indoor Coaching Centre.

Players' Benevolent Fund

The Association had been providing the Medical Pension to the former Bengal players viz. Rs.2,500/- p.m. between the ages of 60-80 and Rs.3,500/- p.m. having age above 80. However, the said Medical Pension has been enhanced to 4,000/- p.m. from 2,500/- p.m. and to 5,000/- p.m. from 3,500/- p.m. in favour of former Bengal players between the ages of 60-80 and having age above 80 respectively.

Foundation Day

This year The Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB) celebrates its 92nd Foundation Day earmarking 40th Frank Worrell Day on 3rd February, 2020. The Association's Flag was hoisted by the Vice President, Shri Naresh Ojha and garlanded the Dr. B. C. Roy's Statue. As a part of the Day's celebration programme, a Mass Blood Donation Camp was organized in collaboration with the Association of Voluntary Blood Donors, West Bengal at Eden Gardens, Kolkata and in the 18 District Headquarters along with Chittaranjan Selfless Service Society, Kulti Town Social Welfare Committee of Bardhaman Dist., SOUL of Bankura and Ghatal Voluntary Blood Donors' Association - Paschim Medinipur under the supervision of the respective District Sports Associations in collaboration with the District Government Hospitals and recognized Blood Banks. The Programme was started with distribution of the Fruits and flowers amongst the ailing patients of Dr. B. C. Roy Memorial Hospital for Child and Thallassaemia Society of India. A short statement of the Blood Donation Camps organized from the year 1981 is given below with the names of the signatories who had very kindly signed the certificates over the years, and which were handed over to the blood donors. This was the 40th year of Blood Donation Camp in which 1961 Blood Donors donated their valuable blood in Kolkata and the Districts. This year, certificates have been given to all blood donors duly signed by Rohit Sharma, the renowned cricketer of Team India.

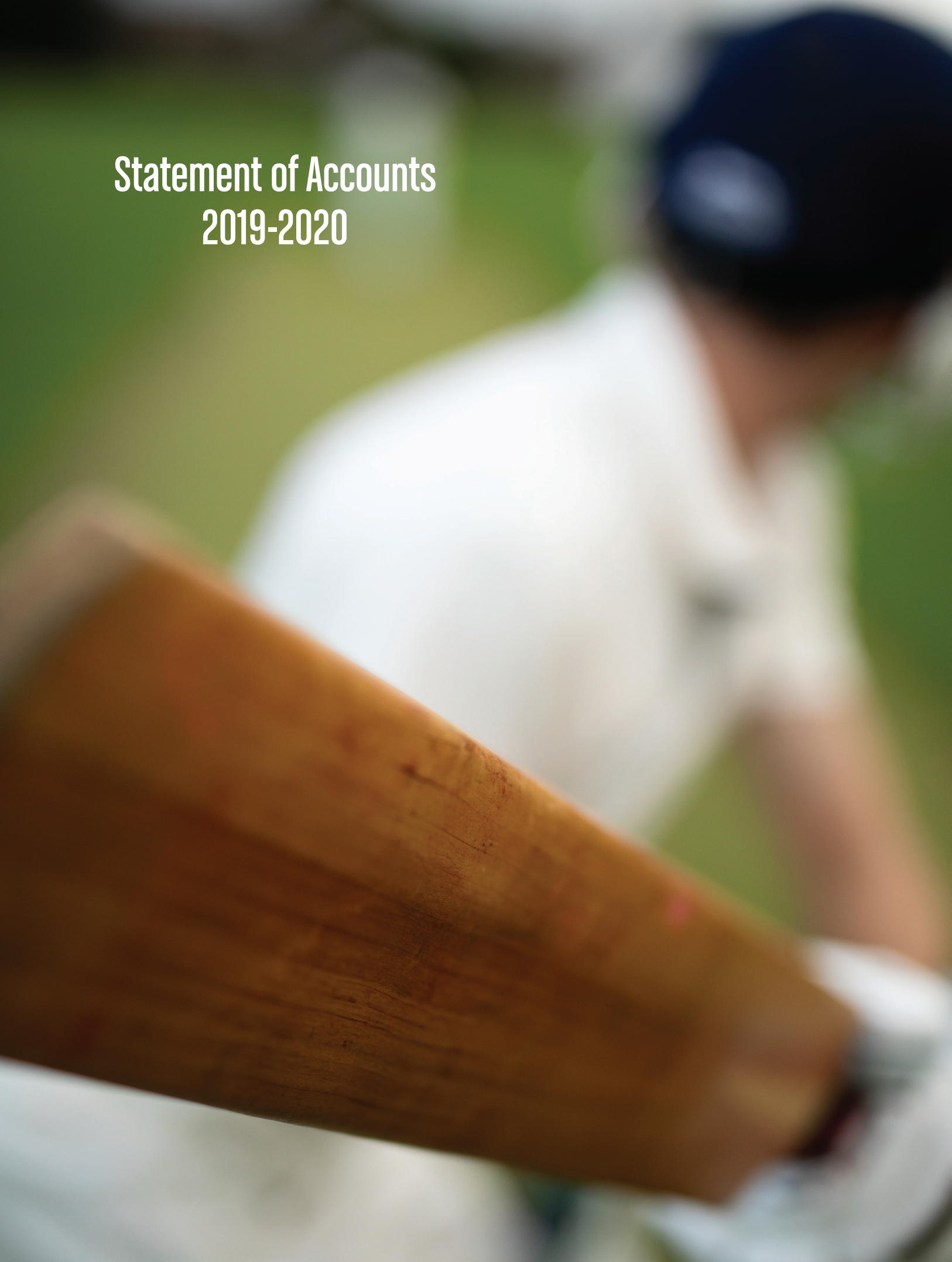

Statement of Accounts 2019-2020



Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of the Cricket Association of Bengal

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements.

I. Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of THE CRICKET ASSOCIATION OF BENGAL ("the Association"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31st 2020, the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required, in the manner so required, and give a True and Fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards mandated by the Institute of Chartered Accounts of India ("the ICAI") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- A. In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the State of Affairs of the Association as at March 31st, 2020 and
- B. In the case of the Income and Expenditure Account, of the Excess of Expenditure over Income for the year ended on that date.

II. Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) recommended by the ICAI. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements" section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the "Code of Ethics" issued by the ICAI together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the financial statements.

III. Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention, without qualifying our report, to the under-noted matters:

- a. The Association's pending preparation of fixed assets register resulting in its inability to undertake physical count of fixed assets and consequent non identification of discrepancies between physical availability and book records;
- b. Pending confirmation of balances from creditors, receivables and debtors;
- c. Our reliance on legal opinion referred to in Note B (5) of Schedule-D

IV. Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Associations Executive Management is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annual Report including the Annexures





thereto, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon. In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements of our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

V. Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgement, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current year. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

VI. Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

The Associations Executive Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance for safeguarding of the assets of the Association and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies ; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view in accordance with Accounting Standards and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the executive management is responsible for assessing the Association 's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless it either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Associations Executive Management is also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process.

VII. Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Standards on Auditing ('the SAs) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:



- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards. From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters.

We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

SCHEDULE 'D'

The Cricket Association of Bengal

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 2020

A. Significant Accounting Policies:

1. Basis of Accounting:

The accounts of the Association are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards except where otherwise stated. For recognition of Income & Expenditure, accrual basis of accounting is followed except for transactions stated otherwise.

2. Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

- Fixed Assets are stated at cost (including installation expenses) less depreciation for assets acquired for International Matches for which depreciation is provided for on Straight Line Method at rates applicable under Schedule-XIV of erstwhile Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation on the other assets is provided on Written Down Value Method at rates applicable under Schedule-XIV of erstwhile Companies Act, 1956.
- Leasehold land and development including construction thereon are amortized on straight line method over a period of ten (10) years.

3. Investment:

Investments, being long term in nature, are held at cost.

4. Inventories:

Inventories in cricket balls, electrical goods are held at lower of cost and realizable value, Cost is determined on FIFO basis. Scrap materials are held at nil value which is accounted for at the point of sale.

5. Retirement Benefits:

- Employer's Contribution towards Provident Fund and Employee's State Insurance are charged to Income & Expenditure Account.
- The Association accounts for gratuity and leave encashment benefits on the basis of management estimate on the assumption that all employees are retiring on balance sheet date.

6. Accounting of Income & Expenditure of Matches:

- Expenses pertaining to Domestic Cricket have been accounted for under single comprehensive expenditure head of account (net of income, if any) named after Tournament / Competition concerned.
 - Expenditure incurred in International Tournaments or Tournaments organized by any outside body under administration of the Association are incorporated in the year, the last match of the tournament is played.
- Annual subsidy/grant including amount for hosting international matches are recognized in general account. These are accounted for in the year of realization/ deemed realization in application of AS-9 issued by ICAI considering uncertainty element involved in receipt of grant/subsidy including quantum thereof.
- Specifically earmarked fund accounts are classified under broad head of Sundry Creditors and others.
- Licence fee, being one time consideration amount received against corporate boxes given on the long term operational lease, is amortized on straight line method over the period of lease.
- Liability on account of lease rent payable to the office of the Defence Estates Officer, Kolkata Circle, Govt of India, Ministry of Defence on account of Joint arrangement, lays down relevant liability as follows :





- (i) Higher of Rs. 6.5 lacs or 0.5% for gross revenue upto Rs.13 crores with escalation thereon @ 1% per annum for gross revenue exceeding Rs.13 crores, and,
- (ii) For IPL matches held at Eden Garden, additional rent is attracted for number of days of play in proportion to annual (365 days) rent on such account, the latter being determined at 0.5% of market value of the land as computed by Defence.

Rental obligation of the association is entirely determined by defence from time to time and pending such determination in respect of any financial year at the point of closing of Accounts, Rs.6.5 lacs is provided for towards annual rent and additional amount payable thereon for the year is provided for subsequently in the year of receipt of demand notice from office of the Defence Estates Officer, Kolkata Circle, Govt of India, Ministry of Defence based on its calculation.

7. Contingent Liabilities:

Disputed liabilities and claims against the association are provided in accounts unless no reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation or possibility of future cash out flow is remote. Otherwise the same is disclosed by way of notes on accounts.

B. Notes on Accounts:

1. Merged herein, with the general accounts, are the separate accounts of Indian Premium League matches held on different dates between 24TH March 2019 to 28th April 2019 and India vs. Bangladesh Test Match, 2019 held from 22nd November, 2019 to 26th November, 2019 all played at Eden Gardens, Kolkata.
2. Reliance World Cup Accounts 1987, forming part of security deposit in liability side of the balance sheet includes Rs. 6,84,475/- (previous year Rs. 6,84,475/-) against Civcon Construction Pvt. Ltd. a party having commenced legal proceeding against the Association on alleged ground of wrongfully forfeiting their due for non performance of the terms of contract within the maintenance period. While the contractor has filed a suit in the Hon'ble High Court at Kolkata claiming refund of the security deposit with interest and compensation against loss of profit, the Association has filed counter claim for damage of Rs. 4,50,000/- (previous year Rs.4,50,000/-) along with interest and cost apart from refuting the claim of the party. The cases are pending before the Hon'ble Court, Kolkata.

Association has made provision for Rs. 8,15,228/- against said disputed liability on account of principal due in application of AS-29 issued by ICAI. There was no movement of provision during the year and timing of possible outflow of fund in this regard is not readily ascertainable.

3. For live telecasting the matches of HERO CUP, CAB conferred exclusive rights to TWI.DD claiming exclusive right of telecast of all matches in India refused to grant up-linking to CAB/TWI. CAB had to challenge the same in Kolkata High Court, which passed an order dated 12th November, 1993 directing grant of licence to TWI to telecast the matches. The Court also granted leave to DD to telecast in India the matches. DD was specifically directed that all collections of revenue on account of sponsorship or otherwise available for commercial purposes that would be realized by DD during the course of telecast shall be kept in a separate account and shall not be dealt with until further order. Ultimately the subject case went to the Apex Court that delivered the historic judgment setting down the laws and right of telecast of matches upholding the contentions of CAB. In course of hearing DD admitted having received a sum of Rs. 96,83,000/- (previous year Rs. 96,83,000/-) towards advertisement from telecast of HERO CUP Matches. The Apex Court also directed the Kolkata High Court to apportion the said amount between CAB and DD after hearing the parties. CAB has since filed application in the Kolkata High Court claiming 80% of the revenue received and/ or realized by DD together with interest @18% per annum as well as penal interest @6% per annum and costs. Pending verdict of Hon'ble High Court, no income has been recognized in this connection.
4. RDG Interior Decoration Exterior Architecture Pvt. Ltd., a contractor entrusted to interior decoration, civil renovation & re-fabrication work, raised a bill for Rs.92,29,324/- (previous



year Rs. 92,29,324/-) for its work. After due joint verification by the qualified engineers/surveyors of the Association and the contractor, the association's surveyor has recommended a payment of Rs. 50,28,787/- (previous year Rs. 50,28,787/-), which amount has been booked as expenditure in the accounts. Although the party has claimed the full amount, the Association is of the view that the payment made is adequate and no further provisions are necessary. Considering the above Rs. 7,71,213/- (previous year Rs.7,71,213/-) due from the contractor has been accounted for as advance considered good. Neither any provision has been made for the difference of bill amount. Relevant expense has been recognized based on recommendation of surveyor of the Association.

The contractor has referred the matter to the Hon'ble High Court at Kolkata and the matter is sub-judice at present.

5. The Association has taken legal opinion on absence of tax liability in respect of any segment of its income.

6. Contingent Liabilities : (Not being provided for)

- a) Income Tax demands/disputed in appeal in respect of :
 - i) Assessment Year - 2015-2016, Rs. 14,11,75,490
 - ii) Assessment Year - 2016-2017, Rs. 14,85,94,505
 - iii) Assessment Year - 2017-2018, Rs. 9,62,42,754
- b) Service tax demand amounting to Rs.4,18,18,921/- (previous year Rs.4,18,18,921/-) on account of penalty had been disputed by the Association and the matter was pending disposal by the Tribunal. The Association has opted for the Sabka Vishwas (Legacy Dispute Resolution) Scheme, 2019 (SVLDRS) and obtained the final discharge certificate against payment of Rs. 2,09,09,461.
- c) Service Tax demand (relating to period from F.YR 2010-11 to 2014-2015) amounting to Rs. 116,01,60,614 (previous year Rs. 116,01,60,614) including interest u/s 75 of Finance Act, 1994 and penalty, has been imposed by the Principal Commissioner of Service Tax. The Association has paid Rs.16,62,99,727/- through GAR-7 as reflected in ST-3. The Association has filed an appeal to CESTAT on 29.03.2017 for setting aside of the Order-in-Original no.124/PR.COMMR/ST-1/KOL/2016-17 dated 26/12/2016, with all relief consequential thereto and the said matter is pending disposal.

The Association had opted for SVLDRS and paid Rs 3.37 Crores. But, the tax authorities denied the benefit and demanded Rs 20 Crores to settle the case under the scheme. The Association has decided to file a Writ petition before the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court challenging the SVLDRS rejection order. Therefore, the original appeal gets restored before CESTAT, Kolkata and shall be heard in due course.

7. Rent for 5 years i.e. 15-06-2012 to 14-06-2018 has been finalized by the office of the Defence Estates Officer, Kolkata Circle, Govt of India, Ministry of Defence at Rs. 6,92,10,011 as intimated vide its letter dated June 4, 2019 and the same has been provided for in the current year's accounts.

Further to Accounting Policy No. 6(e) addressing on account of rent, the entire liability being matured on current year has been provided in current year only in terms of AS-5.

8. Current Assets-Loans & Advances include Rs. 5,15,24,661 (previous year Rs. 1,58,90,300) on account of tax deducted at source during the year by various parties which is pending reconciliation vis-à-vis departmental records showing amount of Rs. 4,89,23,659.00 (previous year Rs. 3,39,78,541.89) as per Form 26AS.
9. Advance against TDS Rs.11,70,550 relates to erroneous TAN marked by RBI against company's receivable which have subsequently been rectified by RBI though fiscal department is yet to concede corresponding refund in favour of the company.
10. Figures for the previous year have been re-arranged as and when necessary to conform to the current year's grouping.
