Message from the President



I welcome all of you to the 90th AGM of the Cricket Association of Bengal. We are going through an unprecedented time. The second wave of the pandemic was much more cruel and unforgiving as we watched helplessly from our homes as we went through the second lockdown in two years.

But this time we were prepared to meet the pandemic armed with the experience of the first wave. The first job at hand was to get the players and everyone associated with the game vaccinated. As we speak we have been able to vaccinate majority of the stake holders. Only the ones below 18 have not yet been vaccinated as there is no provision to inoculate them. Once the government begins their vaccination, we will get on with the job.

We simultaneously got the players' pre-season going with V. V. S. Laxman holding a camp with the Bengal probable. Last season we had not performed to the expectation that has been a cause for concern at the back of our mind and hence several changes were made in the coaching staff. Notable additions include appointing Saurasish Lahiri as the Assistant Coach of Senior Bengal Team, Laxmi Ratan Shukla as the coach of the U25 side and Devang Gandhi given the responsibility of the U19 Team. We have worked closely with the various committees to draw up a plan so that we can begin the season as soon as possible.

We have also decided to make Bengal T20 Challenge into a feeder tournament where we can test and bring out promising talents and accordingly CAB fielded six teams consisting of 120 players selected only on basis of their merit and performance. The fact that we got the tournament started in September goes to show the opportunity we created for the players ahead of the Domestic Season.

Meanwhile, several upgradation plans have been put into place. Besides giving a facelift to the Eden Gardens Clubhouse, players' dressing room, plans are afoot to change the metal halide lights from the towers with LED lights and also repair, upgrade and construct





roof over the various galleries. Plans are also in place to change the seats at Eden Gardens. This is not all we in the last lap of planning before commencing the work of the Museum we would call—Eternal Eden, along with a cafeteria and memorabilia shop.

This apart we have been able to get the necessary permissions for creating a stadium at Dumurjola and the lease has been extended to 99 years. Steps have also been taken for installation of Flood Lights at the Jadavpur University 2nd Campus Ground Salt Lake. We have also decided to develop the facilities and infrastructure in the districts to help cricketers. Understandings have been reached with North Bengal University and Visva Bharati to develop their grounds and build the cricketing infrastructure there that can be used for practice camps and tournaments by the district level cricketers. Plans are also afoot to increase the residential capacity at Bengal Cricket Academy at Kalyani.

We have also decided to issue 2500 Life Members will be taken in as one of the several measures undertaken to raise funds for the association. I am happy to state here that our accounts show a positive balance after expenditure in the last fiscal to the tune of Rs 53 crore. As promised, we have lowered the non cricketing expenses.

Before I conclude, I would like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow office bearers for their vision, hard work and complete cooperation without which nothing would have been possible. I also express my gratitude towards all the Committee Chairmen and the members for putting their best foot forward to see that the game continues unhindered.

I take this opportunity to thank the Government of West Bengal and the local authorities for their constant support and cooperation at every step.

I wish you and your family good health and hope we will be freed from this blight of nature soon.

Secretary's Report



Respected Chairman, Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I am delighted to welcome you all to the 90th Annual General Meeting on behalf of the Cricket Association of Bengal. It is wonderful to see you joining us. I trust your family and you are keeping well in the midst of this pandemic. You are aware how this virus has disrupted that entire conventional ambience.

Our Association's performance during the cricket season 2020-2021 has remained robust despite some major challenges including unfavourable condition. I gratefully acknowledge your continued trust and support extended to the Association during the tournaments. This makes our efforts even more gratifying.

Even with the pandemic showing little mercy, the Bengal team had participated in three BCCI tournaments in the 2020-2021 cricket season namely Vijay Hazare Trophy Tournament and Syed Mushtaq Ali T-20 Tournament in Men's category and Senior Women's One Day Tournament in the Eves' category. The performance of the Men's Team could have been better in these two tournaments with the group matches of Vijay Hazare Trophy and Syed Mushtaq Ali T-20 Tournament being held at Kolkata. The performance of Bengal Women's team in the Sr. Women's One Day Tournament was notable as they reached the Final but lost to Railways.

It may not be out of place to mention here that the Association has successfully completed its inaugural edition of Bengal T20 Challenge Tournament from 24th November to 9th December 2020 at Eden Gardens with majority of matches were played under floodlights and Women's One Day Tournament during April, 2021 following the guidelines in line of the State Government. CAB also completed 1st Division and 2nd Division One Day (League-cum-Knockout) Tournaments as well as J. C. Mukherjee Trophy Tournament and N. C. Chatterjee Memorial Trophy Tournament maintaining all Covid protocols.





Apart from the above, the Association also completed Inter-District T-20 Tournament and District Women's T-20 Tournament. The Final of Inter District T-20 Tournament and Inter District Women's T-20 Tournament were held at Eden Gardens and J. U. 2nd Campus Ground, Salt Lake respectively. It would not have been possible without your support and cooperation.

The Association also arranged for regular RT-PCR Tests for players and team officials in the 1st Division and 2nd Division tournaments. Besides this, the Association has completed vaccination programme for Bengal players (Men's & Women's) along with its Members, Staff, Groundsmen and everyone associated with the game. The below 18 cricketers will be vaccinated whenever government allows it.

The Association has undertaken required renovation jobs at Eden Gardens and J. U. 2nd Campus Ground. The Association has considered to reinforce the 'D' Block as well as renovate the roof of F, G & H Blocks. The towers at Eden Gardens would also be fitted with new LED lights. The survey of setting Flood Light Towers at JU 2nd Campus Ground has already been done and proposal made to construct a two-storey pavilion at the same venue.

Before we proceed with the detailed report, we have the sacred duty to remember those personalities who have left for us, but had rendered invaluable services to the game of cricket.

Jiban Krishna Ghosh

The former Ranji Trophy player left for heavenly abode on 18th February, 2021 at the age of 75. He was a right handed batsman and right arm medium fast bowler and played for Bengal as well as Railways during the period between 1965-66 and 1973-74. He scored 582 runs with an avg. of 21.55 and took 41 wkts. in 20 First Class matches. His best bowling figure was 7 wkts. for 15 runs. He was loved and respected by all.

Prithwish Ghosh Chowdhury

The former Working Committee member of the Association passed away on 30th April, 2021. He had served the Association as member of different sub-committees from time to time and also served as Chairman of Membership Sub-Committee of the Association from 2015-16 to 2018-19. He was respected and loved by all.

Suhas Chandra Basu

The former Vice-President of the Association passed away on 3rd May, 2021 at the age of 66. He had served this Association as Member of different Sub-Committees from time to time. He was an amiable personality and loved by all.

Surajit Kr. Naskar

The former Hony. Asst. Secretary (2010-11 to 2011-2012) of this Association passed away on 18th May, 2021. He had a long association with CAB and served the Association as a member of different sub-committees from time to time. He was an amiable personality and loved by all.

Timir Ghosh

The former Vice-President of the Association passed away on 3rd June, 2021 at Murshidabad. He had served the Association as Vice-President during 2008-09 and 2009-10 and as Member of different Sub-Committees of the Association from time to time. He was associated with Murshidabad District Sports Association. He was an amiable personality and loved by all. The Association hoisted Flag half mast in respect to his departed soul.



Rabi Banerjee

The former Ranji Trophy player left for heavenly abode on 9th June, 2021 at the age of 70. He was a right handed batsman and right arm medium fast bowler and played for Bengal during the period between 1969-70 and 1974-75. He scored 113 runs with an avg. of 12.55 and took 11 wkts. in 10 First Class matches. His best bowling figure was 2 wkts. for 29 runs. He was loved and respected by all.

Hari Narayan Rajguru

The former Ranji Trophy cricketer left for heavenly abode at the age of 81. He played two first-class matches for Bengal in 1960-61. He was Right handed batsman and Right arm medium fast bowler. His best bowling figure was 3 wkts. for 72 runs. He was loved and respected by all.

Yashpal Sharma

The Indian International cricketer passed away on 13th July, 2021 at the age of 66 due to a massive heart attack. He was an explosive middle order Right handed batsman who played during the 1970s and 80s. He was a member of the India team that won the 1983 Cricket World Cup and was the second leading run scorer for India with 240 runs in eight matches. He represented India in 37 Tests and 42 One Day Internationals between 1978 and 1985. He scored 1606 runs in 37 Tests with batting avg. 33.45. He made 2 centuries in tests and top score was 140. He served as India's national cricket selector from 2003 to 2006. He again became selector for the National Team in 2008 and served until 2011. During his second tenure as selector, India won the 2011 Cricket World Cup. He later served as the Coach for Uttar Pradesh Ranji Team. In 2014, he was appointed as the Head of Delhi's Cricket Advisory Committee.

Murtaza Yukubhai Lodhgar

The former Bengal Ranji player and current Mizoram's Under-19 Coach passed away on 17th September, 2021 due to cardiac arrest at the age of 45 at Vishakapatnam. He was Left arm spinner and played 9 first class matches between 1997 and 2007. He captured 34 wickets and his best bowling figure was 6 wickets for 28 runs in his career. He had also served the Association as Coach of Bengal Women's Squad. To pay the respect to the departed soul of Late Murtaza Yukubhai Lodhgar, the Association hoisted Flag half mast. He was an ever smiling and humble person.

Vijay Hazare Trophy: 2020-2021

This year the Elite Group – E matches involving Bengal, Services, J&K, Saurashtra, Haryana and Chandigarh of this tournament were held at West Bengal under supervision of The Cricket Association of Bengal. The group matches were held at Eden Gardens, J. U. 2nd Campus Ground and 22 Yards (Videocon) Ground from 21st February to 1st March, 2021. The Senior Bengal Team led by Anustup Majumdar started well by defeating Services but failed to keep the rhythm. Bengal won the matches against Services and J&K but lost to Saurashtra, Haryana & Chandigarh and could not qualify to the next level

Mr. Arun Lal was the Coach of the Senior Bengal Team.

However, the Bengal team did not qualify for the knock-out stage.

Women's Cricket

The Senior Bengal, participated in One Day Tournament run by the BCCI.

Senior Women's One Day Tournament: 2020-21

This year the Senior Women's Team played in Elite Group 'B' and the tournament (League) was held at Rajkot, Rajasthan from 11th March to 21st March 2021 along with Railways, Saurashtra, Haryana, Assam and Uttarakhand. The Senior Women's Team put up an excellent show in the league stage and won 4 out of 5 matches. They only lost to Railways in league stage. Accordingly, the Senior team qualified for the knock-out stage.

ROXX Bengal T-20 Challenge

The inaugural edition of Bengal T-20 Challenge played at Eden Gardens in association with TCM powered by Dream 11 in a Bio-secure Environment from 24th November to 9th December, 2020 following BCCI Playing Conditions for Men's T-20 Matches and Anti Corruption measures have been adhered during the tournament. The purpose behind organizing this tournament was to identify, promote and nurture talent from the State.

During the tournament, CAB inaugurated two tableaus displaying the logo and teams of the Roxx Bengal T20 Challenge. Shri Barun Kr. Roy, Principal Secretary of Deptt. of Youth Services and Sports, Govt. of West Bengal inaugurated Roxx Bengal T20 Challenge mobile vans in the presence of CAB officials. The tableaus went around the city for spreading awareness about the tournament.

Total Six (6) Teams viz. Mohun Bagan AC, East Bengal Club, Tapan Memorial Club, Town Club, Kalighat Club and Calcutta Customs Club, selected from the 1st division clubs based on their performance in the group stage of the 1st Divn. League Tournament: 2019-20 season, participated in this tournament. Each team has 15 players in their ranks, 7 of those were retained by the team as Marquee Players from their existing squad and 8 were picked up at a draft with 4 more players named as stand-bys. A total 33 games were played in 17 days in the tournament, with each team playing the other twice, followed by the semi-finals and the final, with a majority of them under lights. The draft conducted at a Kolkata Hotel and all the players, support staff and every one else associated with the tournament were staying in a five star hotel and maintaining strict Covid Protocol demanded by the Bio-Bubble environment. Regular Tests and a team of doctors were kept at hand to prevent any sudden outbreak.

The matches of the tournament were held in a competitive and exciting environment and Final (D/N) of the inaugural edition of this tournament between Tapan Memorial Club and Mohun Bagan Athletic Club was held within a bi-bubble at Eden Gardens behind closed doors amidst a raging pandemic on 9th December 2020. A Musical Performance was organized in between the two sessions during the break. Tapan Memorial Club clinched the inaugural Champion Trophy beating Mohun Bagan Athletic Club and the Captain of Tapan Memorial Club, Shahbaz Ahamad, was adjudged 'Man of the Match'.

Office Sports Federation

The Federation could not conduct the Inter Office Cricket League and Knock-Out Tournament for the Cricket season 2020-2021 due to the restrictions during COVID-19 pandemic.

Umpiring

This season, eight tournaments and approximately 464 matches of 8 tournaments have been played in Kolkata and different districts of West Bengal. During this pandemic situation the tournaments were played following strict safety protocols, the matches were efficiently conducted by the umpires by maintaining the guidelines laid down by the Association. Like previous years, the Association conducted classes before the season began. This helped the umpire's performance immensely, especially the Junior Umpires as umpires play a vital role in conducting a cricket match. Some final matches of few tournaments were played in Eden Gardens under floodlights.

To review the situation, the sub-committee members paid regular visit to the match days in all the Divisions and also stood by with the field umpires during the matches. This made the umpires more confident. The senior and junior umpires did an excellent job and no complaint was received against the umpires.

Observer

The Match Observers have taken more responsibilities in conducting the game this season. Due to the pandemic, 60-year-old observers were mostly on standby. They carried out their jobs in the first & second Division One Day Tournaments as well as in J. C. Mukherjee Trophy and N. C. Chatterjee Memorial Trophy. Observers ensured that the players are maintaining all covid protocols. They carried sanitizers, masks, oximeter, fumigate m/c, thermal gun with for safety measures and ensured players' kits were sanitized before the match. Temperature of the players were measured, balls were properly sanitized, toilets were checked before and during the match. The observers also ensured that all rules pertaining to SOP were maintained during the matches.

The Association conducted the Observer classes in order to update them and 32 new observers were qualified through viva examination among the 40 that passed in the written examination before.

The Association had taken appropriate action, like suspension of players and officials of the clubs who broke the code of conducts set by CAB, as identified in the reports of Match Observers. This year posting of Match Observers were done in a systematic manner which functioned well.

Scoring

Posting of scorers was done in a systematic way and no complaint was received from any quarter. Scorers attended the ground in time and no major mistakes were found in scoring. Classes were held from time to time during the pandemic situation in order to update them.

Bengal Cricket Academy

This year Bengal Cricket Academy, Kalyani hosted 1st phase & 2nd phase of Inter District T-20 Tournament for Men's as well as Inter District Women's T-20 Tournament. In addition, the Association conducted Fitness Camp and Practice Matches at BCA, Kalyani for the Senior Women's Team. Two Semi Final matches of Inter District T-20 Tournaments were held at BCA, Kalyani.



Ground

The temple of cricket Eden Gardens was all prepared to host the IPL matches but the said tournament was called off due to the ongoing pandemic situation.

After quite a few years the group matches of Vijay Hazare Trophy and Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy were held at Eden Gardens and J. U. 2nd Campus Ground. Everyone praised the wickets and ground conditions. The Association is very much thankful to the ground staff who have worked tirelessly throughout the year to keep the grounds at par with the international standards and received accolades from the cricket fraternity.

This year the curators kept a strict attitude in regard to the ground preparations. They were instructed to submit the reports about the ground conditions to the Association from time to time. The Ground Sub-Committee members of the Association also inspected the grounds. A series of meetings were held in the Association for development of grounds and refresher courses held on requirements of soil. The pre-planning and hard work paid off as the Association was able to resume the tournaments. Accordingly, soil was delivered to the grounds for preparing pitches to ensure that the grounds were ready before commencement of cricket season 2020-21. The Association also looked to upgrade the infrastructure of grounds.

Like earlier, Board matches pertaining to Vijay Hazare Trophy and Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy were played at the Eden Gardens, Jadavpur University 2nd Campus Ground, Salt Lake, Kolkata.

The Bengal Cricket Academy, Kalyani hosted conditioning camp for Sr. Women's Team from 19th January to 5th February, 2021 and also hosted Practice matches of Sr. Women's Squad from 23rd February to 27th February, 2021. The matches of Inter District T-20 (Women's) as well as CAB Women's One Day Tournament was held at Aditya Academy, Barasat.

Like earlier, the Association took full responsibility for preparations and maintenance of P & T ground, Federation ground in addition to the Deshbandhu Park (Oval), Aditya Cricket Academy and Bangabasi Ground at its own cost for CAB Tournaments and Office League matches.

The Ground sub-committee successfully conducted matches at several maidan grounds including CC&FC and 22 Yards ground. The Ground Sub-Committee also monitored matches of 1st & 2nd division One Day (League-cum-Knockout): 2020-2021 and J. C. Mukherjee and N. C. Chatterjee Memorial Trophy Tournaments.

Transfer

Due to pandemic situation, this year player's transfer deferred and the Association organized the computerized Players' Registration for 94 affiliated Clubs from 22nd January to 5th February, 2021. Total 1342 players took transfer out of which 391 players withdrew. The entire process was completed successfully under supervision of Transfer Sub-Committee.

Coaching

The Association conducted extensive coaching activities through online for its U19, U23 and Senior Bengal Squad as well as Senior and Junior Women Cricketers. The net sessions were held under the guidance of the following Coaches:

Mr. Ershad Ahmed and Mr. Sounak Das were selected to attend the Hybrid Level-1 Coach Certification course.

Fitness Camp

The Cricket Association of Bengal conducted fitness camp for the Senior Bengal Squads (Men's & Women's) and Under-23 Bengal Squads (Men's & Women's) at Pankaj Gupta Indoor Coaching Centre maintaining safety protocols following RT-PCR Tests of the players.

Cricket

The Cricket Committee made sure that cricket returned to the iconic Eden Gardens and the Maidan areas as soon as the lockdown was lifted. According to the decision of The Cricket Committee of this Association comprising of Senior Tournament Committee and Tour, Fixture & Technical Committee the cricket season started with T-20 tournaments followed by One Day tournaments keeping in mind the pandemic situation. Total 37 clubs of 1st Division were divided into 9 groups where Group-A consisted of 5 teams and rest of the Groups consisted of 4 teams each. In the Second Division, total 57 clubs were divided into 14 groups where Group-A consisted of 5 teams and rest groups would consist of 4 teams each. Total 16 teams would qualify directly for the knock out stage and of the remaining teams, 7 teams which have come 2nd in the group on the basis of either percentage of points or net run rate or draw of lots would be considered. The tournament schedule had been carefully planned so that the



grounds could be best utilized and within the decided time frame even with the hockey season beginning and the impending state elections with rallies being held in the maidan areas.

All matches were conducted maintaining SOP laid down by the Association in line of notifications given by the Government. No deviation was allowed for safety of players. The Association conducted Covid testing procedures both for players and concerned club officials, one day before the match. A club could play three consecutive days since the validity of RTPCR result is 72 hrs. Reserve Day had been introduced from the knock-out stages of tournaments. Two unique measures taken were the introduction of five-minute break after every 10 overs for on-field sanitization and creating and maintaining a set of Do's and Don'ts in letter so that a protective bubble could be created around the game. One agency has been entrusted to sanitize the tent's toilet before the match and during innings break. This year the wearing of Standard Cricket Compliant helmets when batting against fast or medium paced bowling, wicketkeeping up to the stumps and close fielding positions had been made mandatory for all cricketers.

Like earlier years, the Cricket Committee took some stern steps to maintain the spirit of cricket. After scrutinizing the Match Observer reports and records lying with the association, the committee cautioned the cricketers of different age groups for breaking the CAB's moral code of conduct. The Cricket committee worked hard to ensure that the tournaments were conducted safely and successfully.

Medical

This year, the Association had left no stones unturned to make sure the players, match officials and everyone associated with the game remained safe and the Medical Unit played a nodal and significant role in rendering services for conducting matches pertaining to Board and Domestic tournaments. The Association formed a Standard Operating Procedure to start operations in a safe manner maintaining all safety protocols as notified by the BCCI and State Government from time to time. In addition, the Association also formed a Monitoring Group headed by its Vice – President Naresh Ojha to observe the implementation of the SOP.

The Association tied up with the AMRI and APOLLO Hospitals to vaccinate all Bengal players, support staff, members, staff & associated personnel and the Medical Unit led by Chairman Mr. Pradip Kr. Day needed a special accolade for rendering his excellent services during the period. The Medical Unit also worked hard and conducted RT-PCR tests for players. The Association premises have been regularly sanitized from the beginning of the pandemic under the supervision of Medical Unit's Chairman.

Statistics

The Statistical Committee put efforts to upgrade its record keeping with different programmes and packages in order to have player information at a glance. Respective data for all tournaments and individual performances have been complied in order to ensure availability of any information. The required documents of players related to cricket have been uploaded in the computer for future references. Further improvement of this section is a continuous process and the Association left no stones unturned to keep up with the modern techniques. The committee has taken steps to make the user-friendly scoring app comprising of player's data separately tournament wise including highest strike rate.

Tour

Seminar

In order to develop the overall standard of cricket in our State, the Association conducted classes for Umpires and Observers amidst pandemic situation from time to time to update.

Library - News Letter

The latest edition of Maidan Times has been brought out featuring the away games were held even with a pandemic raging. The Social Media pages have been working overtime sending out information about the association to the world. With over 50,000 strong followers and several floaters it's one of the most vibrant cricket association pages of BCCI. The CAB App has also come into being with news and live match updates just a click away. The Website www.cricketassociationofbengal.com has become a repository of news and information with news reports, notices, pictures, videos and blogs being updated on regular basis.

Stadium

The Association arranged thorough checking of the four Tower Lights and DG sets of H Block and arranged visit for two IIT Electrical Engineers for checkup of the tower lights. According to them, panel controllers of DG sets have been replaced and 2 wood ward controllers, 2 auto voltage regulators (AVRs) and ballast have been changed. In addition, the Association considered synchronizing the system that would reduce the required number of lamps needed to achieve the desirable lux levels during a match and effectively control the cost. The Association explored the possibilities of creating a hospitality section in B Block.

Infrastructure Development

The Association has initiated some steps towards developments of infrastructure at Eden Gardens and J. U. 2nd Campus Ground, Salt Lake:

Eden Gardens:

1. Strengthening of D block structure.
2. Renovation of roofing sheets pertaining to F, G & H blocks.
3. Luminaries of 4 towers to be replaced with LED.
4. Modifications of Tower Lifts.
5. Fixing of Laser Rays to illuminate the inside roof of the stadium.
6. Landscaping work and Construction of Cafeteria, Museum, Hall of Fame etc.
7. Refurbishment of Lower Lobby of Club House, Canteen area and Gate No.1.
8. Upgradation of all toilets of the stadium

J. U. 2nd Campus Ground

1. Setting up Flood Light system.
2. Two Storey Pavilion to be constructed consisting of two dressing rooms, dining for players, kitchen, match official rooms, medical room, PMOA area, Commentary room etc.



Tenders for LEDfication of existing Lighting system of Eden Gardens and Design & Construction of Tensile Membrane roof at existing F, G & H blocks have been floated.

The developments in regard to Cricket facilities at Dumurjola have been undertaken and a letter has been issued to the Govt. of West Bengal following a meeting with the representatives of Government requesting waive of stamp duty and to enhance lease period from 30 years to 99 years.

Players' Benevolent Fund

The Association has been providing the Medical Pension to the former Bengal players (Men's and Women's) viz. Rs. 4,000 per month between the ages of 60-80 and Rs. 5,000 per month having age above 80.

Foundation Day

This year The Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB) celebrated its 93rd Foundation Day earmarking 41st Frank Worrell Day on 3rd February, 2021 by maintaining strict Covid-19 guidelines issued by the Government. The Association's Flag was hoisted by the President followed by garlanding the Dr. B. C. Roy's Statue. As a part of the Day's celebration programme, a Mass Blood Donation Camp was organized in collaboration with the Association of Voluntary Blood Donors, West Bengal at Eden Gardens, Kolkata and in the 17 District Headquarters except Burdwan DSA along with Chittaranjan Selfless Service Society, Kulti Town Social Welfare Committee of Bardhaman Dist., SOUL of Bankura and Ghatal Voluntary Blood Donors' Association – Paschim Medinipur under the supervision of the respective District Sports Associations in collaboration with the District Government Hospitals and recognized Blood Banks. The Programme started with distribution of fruits and flowers amongst the ailing patients of Dr. B. C. Roy Memorial Hospital for Child and Thallassaemia Society of India. A short statement of the Blood Donation Camps organized from the year 1981 is given below with the names of the signatories who had very kindly signed the certificates over the years, and which were handed over to the blood donors. This was the 41st year of Blood Donation Camp in which 1533 Blood Donors donated their valuable blood in Kolkata and the Districts. This year, certificates have been given to all blood donors duly signed by Ms. Jhulan Goswami, the renowned Women's Cricketer of Team India.

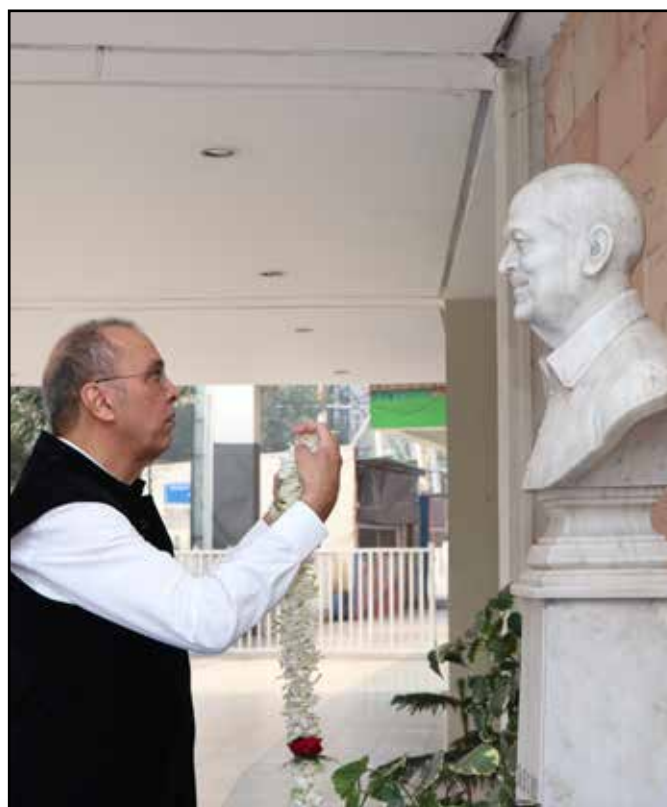

Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of the Cricket Association of Bengal

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

I. Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of THE CRICKET ASSOCIATION OF BENGAL ("the Association"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31st, 2021, the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required, in the manner so required, and give a True and Fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards mandated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("the ICAI") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- A. In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the State of Affairs of the Association as at March 31st, 2021 and
- B. In the case of the Income and Expenditure Account, of the Excess of Income over Expenditure for the year ended on that date.

II. Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) recommended by the ICAI. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements" section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the "Code of Ethics" issued by the ICAI together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the financial statements.

III. Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention, without qualifying our report, to the under-noted matters:

- a. The Association's pending preparation of fixed assets register resulting in its inability to undertake physical count of fixed assets and consequent non-identification of discrepancies, if any, between physical availability and book records;
- b. Pending confirmation of balances from creditors, receivables and debtors;
- c. Our reliance on legal opinion referred to in Note B(5) of Schedule-D.



IV. Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Associations Executive Management is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annual Report including the Annexures thereto, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon. In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

V. Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current year. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

VI. Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

The Associations Executive Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the statutory provisions for safeguarding of the assets of the Association and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view in accordance with Accounting Standards and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the executive management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless it either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Associations Executive Management is also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process.

VII. Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards. From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters.

We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 2021

A. Significant Accounting Policies:

1. Basis of Accounting:

The accounts of the Association are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards except where otherwise stated. For recognition of Income & Expenditure, accrual basis of accounting is followed except for transactions stated otherwise.

2. Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

- a. Fixed Assets are stated at cost (including installation expenses) less depreciation for assets acquired for International Matches for which depreciation is provided for on Straight Line Method at rates applicable under Schedule–XIV of erstwhile Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation on the other assets is provided on Written Down Value Method at rates applicable under Schedule–XIV of erstwhile Companies Act, 1956.
- b. Leasehold land and development including construction thereon are amortized on straight line method over a period of ten (10) years.

3. Investment:

Investments, being long term in nature, are held at cost.

4. Inventories:

Inventories in cricket balls, electrical goods are held at lower of cost and realizable value, Cost is determined on FIFO basis. Scrap materials are held at nil value which is accounted for at the point of sale.

5. Retirement Benefits:

- a. Employer's Contribution towards Provident Fund and Employee's State Insurance are charged to Income & Expenditure Account.
- b. The Association accounts for gratuity and leave encashment benefits on the basis of management estimate on the assumption that all employees are retiring on balance sheet date.

6. Accounting of Income & Expenditure of Matches:

- a.
 - (i) Expenses pertaining to Domestic Cricket have been accounted for under single comprehensive expenditure head of account (net of income, if any) named after Tournament / Competition concerned.
 - (ii) Expenditure incurred in International Tournaments or Tournaments organized by any outside body under administration of the Association are incorporated in the year, the last match of the tournament is played.
- b. Annual subsidy/grant including amount for hosting international matches are recognized in general account. These are accounted for in the year of realization/ deemed realization in application of AS-9 issued by ICAI considering uncertainty element involved in receipt of grant/subsidy including quantum thereof.
- c. Specifically earmarked fund accounts are classified under broad head of Sundry Creditors and others.
- d. Licence fee, being one time consideration amount received against corporate boxes given on the long term operational lease, is amortized on straight line method over the period of lease.
- e. Liability on account of lease rent payable to the office of the Defence Estates Officer, Kolkata Circle, Govt of India, Ministry of Defence on account of Joint arrangement, lays down relevant liability as follows:



- (i) Higher of Rs. 6.5 lacs or 0.5% for gross revenue upto Rs.13 crores with escalation thereon @ 1% per annum for gross revenue exceeding Rs.13 crores, and,
- (ii) For IPL matches held at Eden Garden, additional rent is attracted for number of days of play in proportion to annual (365 days) rent on such account, the latter being determined at 0.5% of market value of the land as computed by Ministry of Defence.

Rental obligation of the association is entirely determined by Ministry of Defence from time to time and pending such determination in respect of any financial year at the point of closing of Accounts, Rs.6.5 lacs is provided for towards annual rent and additional amount payable thereon for the year is provided for subsequently in the year of receipt of demand notice from the Ministry of Defence.

7. **Contingent Liabilities:**

Disputed liabilities and claims against the association are not provided for in accounts unless reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation or possibility of future cash out flow is certain. The same is disclosed by way of notes on accounts.

B. Notes on Accounts:

1. Merged herein, with the general accounts, is the separate accounts of the Bengal T-20 Challenge Tournament, played at the Eden Gardens from 24th November 2020 to 9th December 2020.
2. Reliance World Cup Accounts 1987, forming part of security deposit in liability side of the balance sheet includes Rs. 6,84,475/- (previous year Rs. 6,84,475/-) against Civcon Construction Pvt. Ltd. a party having commenced legal proceeding against the Association on alleged ground of forfeiting their due for non performance of the terms of contract within the maintenance period stated as wrongful. While the contractor has filed a suit in the Hon'ble High Court at Kolkata claiming refund of the security deposit with interest and compensation against loss of profit, the Association has filed counter claim for damage of Rs. 4,50,000/- (previous year Rs.4,50,000/-) along with interest and cost apart from refuting the claim of the party. The cases are pending before the Hon'ble Court, Kolkata.

The Association has made provision for Rs. 8,15,228/- against said disputed liability on account of principal due in application of AS-29 issued by ICAI read with para A(7) of Significant Accounting Policies. There was no movement of provision during the year and timing of possible outflow of fund in this regard is not readily estimable.

3. For live telecasting the matches of HERO CUP, CAB conferred exclusive rights to TWI. DD claiming exclusive right of telecast of all matches in India refused to grant up-linking to TWI. CAB had to challenge the same in Kolkata High Court, which passed an order dated 12th November, 1993 directing grant of licence to TWI to telecast the matches. The Court also granted leave to DD to telecast in India the matches. DD was specifically directed that all collections of revenue on account of sponsorship or otherwise available for commercial purposes that would be realized by DD during the course of telecast shall be kept in a separate account and shall not be dealt with until further order. Ultimately the subject case went to the Apex Court that delivered the historic judgment setting down the laws and right of telecast of matches upholding the contentions of CAB. In course of hearing DD admitted having received a sum of Rs. 96,83,000/- (previous year Rs. 96,83,000/-) towards advertisement from telecast of HERO CUP Matches. The Apex Court also directed the Kolkata High Court to apportion the said amount between CAB and DD after hearing the parties. CAB has since filed application in the Kolkata High Court claiming 80% of the revenue received and/or realized by DD together with interest @18% per annum as well as penal interest @6% per annum and costs. Pending verdict of Hon'ble High Court, no income has been recognized in this connection.
4. RDG Interior Decoration Exterior Architecture Pvt. Ltd., a contractor entrusted to interior decoration, civil renovation & re-fabrication work, raised a bill for Rs.92,29,324/- (previous year Rs. 92,29,324/-) for it's work. After due joint verification by the qualified engineers/surveyors of the Association and the contractor, the association's surveyor had recommended a payment of Rs. 50,28,787/- (previous year Rs. 50,28,787/-), which amount has been booked as expenditure in the accounts. Although the party had claimed the full amount, the Association is of the view that



the payment made is adequate and no further provisions are necessary. Considering the above Rs. 7,71,213/- (previous year Rs.7,71,213/-) due from the contractor has been accounted for as advance considered good. Neither any provision has been made for the difference of bill amount.

The contractor has referred the matter to the Hon'ble High Court at Kolkata and the matter is sub-judice at present.

5. The Association has taken legal opinion on absence of tax liability in respect of any segment of its income.
6. **Contingent Liabilities: (Not being provided for)**
 - a) Income Tax demands/disputed in appeal in respect of:
 - i) Assessment Year - 2015-2016, Rs. 14,11,75,490
 - ii) Assessment Year - 2016-2017, Rs. 14,85,94,505
 - iii) Assessment Year - 2017-2018, Rs. 9,62,42,754
 - b) Service Tax demand (relating to period from F.YR 2010-11 to 2014-2015) amounting to Rs. 116,01,60,614 (previous year Rs. 116,01,60,614) including interest u/s 75 of Finance Act, 1994 and penalty, has been imposed by the Principal Commissioner of Service Tax. The Association has paid Rs.16,62,99,727/- through GAR-7 as reflected in ST-3. The Association has filed an appeal to CESTAT on 29.03.2017 for setting aside of the Order-in-Original no.124/PR.COMMR/ST-1/KOL/2016-17 dated 26/12/2016, with all relief consequential thereto and the said matter is pending disposal.

The Association had opted for SVLDRS and paid Rs 3.37 Crores. But, the tax authorities denied the benefit and demanded Rs 20 Crores to settle the case under the scheme. The Association has decided to file a Writ petition before the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court challenging the SVLDRS rejection order. Therefore, the original appeal gets restored before CESTAT, Kolkata and shall be heard in due course.
7. Current Assets-Loans & Advances include Rs. 8,86,50,164.00 (previous year Rs. 5,15,24,661) on account of tax deducted at source during the year by various parties which is pending reconciliation vis-à-vis departmental records showing amount of Rs. 8,46,44,613 (previous year Rs. 4,89,23,659) as per Form 26AS.
8. Advance against TDS Rs.11,70,550 relates to erroneous TAN marked by RBI against Association's receivable which have subsequently been confessed by RBI though fiscal department is yet to concede corresponding refund in favour of the Association.
9. The Association has considered the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on its operations and financial statements. It is closely monitoring any material changes and based on current estimates, it expects to recover the carrying amounts of its assets
10. Figures for the previous year have been re-arranged as and when necessary to conform to the current year's grouping.
