





REPORT AND RECOMENDATIONS OF THE APEX COUNCIL

The Report of the Apex Council to be placed in the 91st Annual General Meeting of The Cricket Association of Bengal to be held on 31st October, 2022 for the period 30th September, 2021 to 15th October, 2022.


1. It was brought to the notice of the Apex Council that 54 players were having disputed documents who were intending to participate in the cricket tournaments organised by The Association. Accordingly, the Apex Council referred the case of 54 players to the Hon'ble Ombudsman for redressal. The reference was made to the Hon'ble Ombudsman in order to eradicate the problem plaguing The Association wherein certain players were misrepresenting themselves as "local players" by using false/fabricated documents. The Association has a "zero tolerance" policy towards such act and the conduct of "Players Verification" exercise is to cleanse the system one such step is the inclusion of "bio-metric" system.
2. The Apex Council took the initiative of starting "Office Sports League" with the Office Sports Federation so that the opening of jobs and recruitment may happen in various institutions.
3. The Apex Council approved the installation of "Flood Lights" system at Jadavpur University Ground, Salt Lake and the practice areas.
4. The Apex Council discussed matters pertaining to lease of land at Dumurjala. It was found that there were certain constraints in the land at Dumurjala and that The Association would take up the matter with the State Government and request for alternative land. Presently, discussions are going on for an alternative land at Rajarhat area, Kolkata.
5. The Apex Council mandated all players to be compulsory vaccinated against COVID-19 in order to participate in The CAB Domestic Cricket Tournaments, as the safety of the players and other stake holders were involved.
6. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the cricket season started much later than the usual time period. Such being the scenario, the Apex Council approved the conducting of the 1st and 2nd Division League Tournaments in more groups so that the tournaments could be completed in time.


7. The Apex Council approved "Gayeshpur Ground" for organising of The CAB local matches.
8. The Apex Council approved the "Bengal Women's T-20" which would involve participation of top players.
9. The Apex Council approved the tie up of The Association with The British Council to conduct "Personality development and spoken English classes" for players.
10. The Apex Council approved the "Curators Course" with the objective of educating the participants to perform the role of curators.
11. The Apex Council approved the installation of "LED Flood Lights" with DMX technology at the Eden Gardens, Kolkata so as to make the stadium amongst the best cricket stadiums in the world.
12. The Apex Council approved the refurbishment of roofs at block F, G & H at Eden Gardens stadium and installation of new chairs by replacing the old chairs at the Lower Tier Club House for enhancing the spectator viewing experience especially for the dignitaries who are often invited for the matches.
13. The Apex Council approved the decision to repair D & E blocks which needs immediate attention for the safety of the spectators. After, the World Cup, 2023 the Association may dismantle the existing blocks and reconstruct the same with modern amenities matching international standards.
14. The Apex Council approved interior development work at Club House pertaining to Ground Floor Lounge and Mezzanine Floor Corridor, 2nd Floor Conference Room/VVIP Dining. The Apex Council further approved renovation of Media Centre, Media Room, Press Conference Room, Toilets in the Eden gardens stadium for giving an enhanced facility to the spectators.
15. The Apex Council approved setting up of "temporary dormitories" under the galleries of E,F,G, & H blocks so that the players and support staff may avail of the temporary dormitories during their matches. However, the temporary dormitories would not be used during the course of international matches.


16. The entire tendering process pertaining to installation of "LED Flood Lights" with DMX technology at the Eden Gardens, Interior Works in Club House, Dressing room, VIP Boxes and Installation of Chairs at the lower-tier were approved after threadbare discussion.
17. The Apex Council approved the offer letter sent by The Association to the Defense Authority for renewal of lease of the Eden Gardens, Kolkata.
18. The Apex Council approved a through "Cricket Infrastructure Development Scheme" for a sum of Rs. 1,00,0000/- (Rupees One Lakh Only) each for the affiliated units to set up score board, sight screen, fire fighting system, bowling machines etc. During the period, the Apex Council approved providing automated rollers and lawn movers for the development of better ground conditions which would remain to be property of The Association and the maintenance of the same would be by the Association. The Apex Council also approved sending bowling machines and digital scoreboards to the universities.
19. The Apex Council approved the setting up of a "Food Court" in place of the existing kitchen in "L" Block near Gate no.14.
20. All matters pertaining to the hosting of "Legends League Cricket" was discussed threadbare and the Apex Council approved the hosting of the matches after hearing the matter in details.
21. The Apex Council approved the amendment to The CAB Rules in terms of the order dated 14th September, 2022 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. It also proposed that the Special General Meeting may be held so that the process be completed in accordance with law. Further on, the Apex Council approved extension of time for holding the Annual General Meeting, 2022 of the Association and empowered the Office-Bearers to take up the matter with The Registrar of firms, Societies and Non-Trading Corporations. The Registrar informed the Association to conclude the Annual General Meeting within a period of 15 months.
22. In order to professionalize the management system at The Association, the Apex Council decided to change designations of staff members of the Association and an organizational chart be prepared.



23. The Apex Council approved the holding of the Annual Awards ceremony for the year 2019, 2020 and 2021 seasons on 29th October, 2022 as it could not be held due to the restrictions placed because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
24. The Apex Council approved the holding of 1st Divisions league from November, 2022.
25. The Apex Council appreciated the ticket distribution process adopted during the international and IPL matches held during this period.
