

Specific Bye-Laws for the
“CAB Women’s Club Cricket Tournament T-20” for the year 2025-2026.”

1. The Tournament shall be played on League cum Knock-out basis in Four Phases according to the **Administrative Rules & General Bye-Laws : 2024 -2025** of the Association as provided and the **Specific Bye-Laws** mentioned hereunder:

a) Main Phase (League):

14 Clubs, who played in the Main Phase last season; named ‘East Bengal Club’, ‘Wari A.C.’, ‘Town Club’, ‘Aryan Club’, ‘Mohun Bagan A.C.’, ‘Md. Sporting Club’, ‘Rajasthan Club’, ‘Kalighat Club’, ‘Barisha Sporting Club’, ‘Bhawanipore Club’, ‘City A.C.’, ‘Salkia Friends Asso.’, ‘Ariadaha Sporting Club’ and ‘Calcutta Police Club’ and the 2 Qualified Clubs – ‘Cossipore Club’ and ‘Gymkhana’ from the “Qualifier Round”, that is total **16 clubs**; will be divided in 4 Groups in ‘Group- A’, ‘Group- B’, ‘Group- C’ and ‘Group- D’, with 4 teams in each group, to play against each other in their respective once only on League basis.

b) Main Phase (Knockout):

After the “Main Phase” the top ranked teams of each group will qualify for the 2 Semi Final Matches and Winners of the Semi Final will play the Final match which shall determine the “Winner” and “Runner-up” of the Tournament.

2. **White “SG Club White (5 Oz)” Balls, Color Dress and Black Sight Screen** to be used in all the matches of the Tournament, Balls will be provided by the Association.

3. **a) Hours of Play and duration of Interval(in all the Matches):-**

Morning Match:

09.30 A.M. To 10.50 A.M. (First Innings)
10.50 A.M. To 11.10 A.M. (Break)
11.10 A.M. To 12.30 P.M. (Second Innings)

Afternoon Match:

01-30 P.M. To 02-50 P.M. (First Innings)
02-50 P.M. To 03-10 P.M. (Break)
03-10 P.M. To 04-30 P.M. (Second Innings)

However, the above time schedule may be altered by the **Tour, Fixture & Technical Committee**, if required, with prior intimation to the participating teams.

- (b)** All matches shall be of one innings duration and shall be limited to 20 overs per side, unless All-out earlier. A minimum of 5 overs to each team shall constitute a match.

- (c)** Declaration of a side’s innings is not permitted.

(d) The innings of the team batting second shall not commence before the scheduled time for commencement of the second session unless the team batting first has completed its innings prior to the scheduled Break. In such case, 20 minutes Break shall take place and then the team batting second shall commence its innings correspondingly earlier.

Where the play is delayed or interrupted the umpires are authorized to reduce the length of the Break as follows:—

Time Lost Interval

Upto 60minutes	-	15 minutes
Between 60 and 120 minutes	-	10 minutes.

4. Length of Innings (in all the matches):-

(a) In an uninterrupted match :

(i) Each team shall bat for 20 **overs** within 80 minutes unless all out earlier.

(Total 80 minutes allotted to each team which includes Medical attention, changing of ball, Ball retrieval, insufficient time for rolling etc.)

(ii) If the Team batting first is dismissed in less than 20 overs, then the Team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 20 overs.

(b) In the interrupted matches where the start is delayed or where play is suspended due to ground or weather condition before or after commencement of **FIRST** innings:-

(i) The object should always be to re-fix the number of overs so that both the teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs (minimum of full 5 overs) in the allotted time.

(ii) The team batting second must not bat for more number of overs than the team batting first, unless the team bating first is dismissed before their stipulated number of overs.

(iii) The calculation of number of overs to be bowled shall be based on one over for each 4 minutes in the time remaining before the close of play.

(iv) After calculation if ODD number is derived, then one more over shall be added and then the same is to be equally allotted to both the teams, in this case the match may finish late.

(v) When the calculation produces EVEN number, then the fraction of the over, if any, shall be ignored and the total overs would be equally allotted to both the teams, in this case the match may finish early.

(vi) The Interval shall commence accordingly at the time which shall be decided by the umpires.

(c) In the Matches when Second Innings is interrupted:-

(i) If owing to suspension of play during the innings of the team batting second it is not possible for that team to have the opportunity of batting for the same number of

overs as the team batting first, they shall bat for the number of overs, to be calculated as per

Clause 4(b) mentioned above.

(ii) When an interruption occurs in the 2nd innings of the match after calculation on the basis of Remaining playing time being divided by 4 minutes, the fraction of an over shall be ignored and the match may finish early.

(iii) However, if the innings of the team batting first ends before the time of scheduled or rescheduled closing time of their innings and thereby the innings of the team batting second has started correspondingly early, in case of interruption during the second innings, the overs would be reduced only after the amount of time by which the second innings has started early has elapsed.

5. Late start of play and Penalty (in all the matches) :-

(a) If one of the competing team turns up late, or defaults on any other ground, play may commence at any time between 9-30 a.m. and 10-00 a.m. for the Morning Match and between 01.30 p.m and 02.00 p.m for the Afternoon Match. In that event, the defaulting sides shall bat for less than 20 overs. Calculation of overs is to be made as provided hereunder :-

(i) Time lost in starting the match shall be deducted from the allotted time of the innings of the defaulting side to get the remaining playing time of the innings.

(ii) Remaining playing time would be divided by 4 minutes to get the number of overs.

(iii) Fraction of the over would be ignored.

(iv) If the defaulting side fields, its opponent Team shall be entitled to bat for 20 overs or 80 minutes, whichever is earlier, unless the team is all-out earlier.

(b) If both teams turn up late, play may commence at any time between 09-30 a.m. and 10-00 a.m. and in that event , the umpire shall allot the equal number of over to both the teams taking into account of total remaining playing time being divided by 4 minutes. Same principle as mentioned in Clause 4 (b) hereinabove shall apply.

6. Penalty for failing to bowl scheduled number of overs :-

Law-17 (e) of General Bye-Laws of the Association shall apply.

7. Number of overs per Bowler :-

No bowler shall bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs in an uninterrupted innings, that is 4 overs in a 20 overs match.

In a delayed or interrupted match where the total overs are reduced, normally no bowler shall be allowed to bowl more than one-fifth of the allotted overs. However, when overs of the innings is not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the quota of maximum number of overs of one or more bowlers, to make up the balance.

Example - A : Due to interruption a match is reduced to 10 overs to each side.

5 bowlers can bowl a maximum of 2 overs each.

Example - B : Due to rain a match is reduced to 14 overs to each side.

4 bowlers can bowl maximum 3 overs and one bowler would be permitted to bowl maximum 2 overs.

In the event of a bowler is suspended or breaking down during an over and unable to complete the over, the remaining ball(s) of the over shall be bowled by any other bowler who has not bowled the previous over and shall not bowl next over or part thereof. Such part of an over shall count as a full over for both the bowlers as far as bowler's limitation is concerned.

8. "Free Hit" for "No Ball":-

The delivery following a "No ball" shall be a "Free Hit" for whichever batter is facing it. If the delivery for a "Free Hit" is not a legitimate delivery ("No ball" or "Wide Ball"), then the next delivery shall also be a "Free Hit".

Changing of field placement and position of fielders are not permitted for the "Free Hit" delivery, unless there is a change of striker. But if "No Ball" is called for contravention of "Field Restriction" or "Limitation of on-side fielder", minimum adjustment shall be allowed.

The Bowler's end umpire shall signal "No Ball" to the scorer and then signal a "Free Hit" by extending one arm straight upwards and moving it in a circular motion.

In case of "Free Hit" delivery, he batter can only be dismissed under **Law-21 ("No Ball")**.

9. Field Restriction for all the matches :-

Two semi circles shall be drawn on the field of play. The Semi Circles shall have as their centre the Middle stump at either side of the pitch. The radius of each of the Semi Circles shall be 23 meters (25.15 yards). The Semi Circles shall be linked by Two parallel straight lines drawn on the field.

The Field restriction area should be marked by continuous painted white lines or dots or discs at 5 yards interval.

At the instant of delivery :

Powerplay- : No more than two (2) fielders shall be permitted outside this field restriction area. In an innings of 20 overs, these are overs 1 to 6 inclusive.

During non-Powerplay overs, in an uninterrupted match from 7th to 20th over, no more than four (4) fielders shall be permitted outside this fielding restriction area.

In circumstance when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of overs within each phase of the innings shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd Innings of the match.

Innings Duration	Power Play
5 - 8	2
9 - 11	3
12 - 14	4
15 - 18	5
19 - 20	6

If play is interrupted during an innings and the table above is already exhausted, the Non-Power play takes immediate effect. For the avoidance of doubt this applies even if the interruption has occurred mid-over.

In the event of an infringement of "Field Restrictions", the Striker's-end umpire shall call and signal "No Ball".

10. Wide bowling – Judging a Wide :-

Law-22 of General Bye-Laws shall apply.

11. The Result (Qualifier Round, Main Phase and Final):-

- (a) Result shall be achieved if both the Teams have the opportunity to play at least (minimum full 5 overs) unless either of the teams are all-out in less than 5 overs or the Team batting second scores enough runs to win the match in less than 5 overs.
- (b) In the match where both the Teams have had the opportunity to play for full 20 overs or the stipulated number of overs in interrupted match (minimum full 5 overs), the Team scoring higher number of runs shall be the "Winner".
- (c) If the scores are equal, than the Team who have lost lesser number of wickets, shall be the "Winner".
- (d) If the runs as well as the fall of wickets of both the Teams are equal, then the result will be "Tie".
- (e) If play is suspended in the second innings of the match due to weather or ground conditions and then number of overs have been revised to a lesser number (minimum full 5 overs) then the "Target Score" which the Team batting second must exceed to win the match shall be calculated by multiplying the revised number of overs by the average run per over scored by the Team batting first throughout their innings and adding one run with it. If the "Target Score" involves a fraction of a run, it shall be treated as one run.
- (f) If a match is abandoned due to weather or ground condition before the Team batting second have played the overs allotted to them and they have neither been all-out nor have passed their opponents score, the result shall be decided on the average "Run Rate" of both the Teams throughout their innings. The Team having higher Run Rate shall be the "Winner".
- (g) For the purpose of **Clause 11 (e) & (f)** the fraction of an over bowled is to be treated as full over.
- (h) In the event of Team batting first is all out in less than their allotted overs, the calculation of their "Run-Rate" shall be based on their full allotted quota of overs and not the over when they got all-out.
- (i) Due to late arrival of one Team, if the overs are deducted, then the "Target Score" or "Run Rate" shall be calculated on the basis of original over of the defaulting side and not on the basis of the overs allotted to the Team after deduction of overs for late arrival.
- (j) In case of subsequent interruption due to weather condition and the over are re-allotted to both the Teams, the difference of overs between the defaulting Team and the other

Team shall also be kept in mind at the time of re-allotment of overs and also while calculating the "Target Score or Run Rate."

- (k) If the match could not be started or after start could not be played to finish due to ground or weather conditions, then the match shall be treated as "Drawn".
- (l) If one or both the Team did not get the opportunity to play for minimum full 5 overs due to ground or weather conditions, the match shall be treated as "Drawn".

12. The Points :

- (i) In the League Stage, the points to be earned by the Team would be as under :-

- (ii) The following shall apply to determine the Team who shall qualify to play in the "Main Phase" or in the "Knockout stage of the Main Phase".

(a) Team with highest number of points.

(b) In the event if points of 2 or more Clubs within the Group are equal, after the "Qualifier Round" or the "Main Phase", teams will be selected on the following criteria:

- Team with most number of Wins.
- the Team that won the match against the other team, this will only be applicable if 2 teams are on the same points and same number of wins.
- If not applicable/possible, then the team with the Higher Net Run Rate.
- It still equal, Draw of lots.

(iii) **Net Run Rate :-**

By deducting from the Average run per over scored by a team throughout the competition with the Average Runs per over scored against that Team throughout the competition.

- If the Team is all out before their full quota of overs, the calculation shall be made by their full quota of overs for which they were entitled to.
- Only those matches where result has been achieved, shall be taken into account for Net Run Rate calculation.

(iv) **Tie in the League Stage :**

The result of a match shall be a "Tie" in the League Stage, when the scores are equal and both the teams had lost same number of wickets. If only the scores are equal, then the team losing lesser number of wickets, shall be declared the "Winner".

In the League Stage:

- (i) If the match could not be started or after start could not be played to finish due to ground, weather or light, the match shall be treated as **"No Result"**.
 - (ii) If one or both the Team did not get the opportunity to play for minimum full 5 overs, the match shall be treated as **"No Result"**.
 - (iii) If the match could not be started or is abandoned after commencement and could not be played to finish (minimum 5 overs) due to reason other than the ground, weather or light conditions, the fate of the match shall be decided by the Women's Cricket (Working Group).
- (v) **In the Knock-out Stage :**
1. All the matches in Knock-out stage if could not be started or after start could not be played to finish (at least 5 overs for both the teams) and result is not achieved due to ground, weather or light conditions; or both the number of runs and number of wickets lost by both the teams are equal, then the result of the match (except the Final match) shall be decided by Spin of Coin on the ground in presence of Match Observer / Both the Umpires.
 2. If in any Knock-out Match the scores of both the teams are equal, then the team losing lesser number of wickets, shall be declared the "Winner"; except the Final match.
 3. In the Final Match if the scores are equal and wickets lost by the both the teams are also equal, then "Super Over" shall take place as per "Appendix B" of "General Bye-Laws" of the Association.

13. Replay for the Final Match :-

If the Final Match couldn't yield result on the original day due to ground or weather conditions, then the "Final Match" shall be replayed on another day, to be decided by the "Tour, Fixture & Technical Committee"

If result couldn't be achieved even in the "ReplayedMatch" due to ground or weather condition, or if the Result is a "Tie", then both the teams will be declared as **"Joint Winners"**.

14. Allowable Short Pitch deliveries per Over :-

A bowler shall be limited to one fast short pitched delivery per over. A fast short pitched delivery is defined as a ball, which passes or would have passed above the shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease. The Umpire at the Bowler's-end shall advise the bowler and the Batsmen when each fast short pitched delivery has been bowled.

In addition, a ball that passes above head height of the batter, standing upright at the popping crease, that prevents him from being able to hit it with his bat by means of a normal cricket stroke, shall be called "Wide".

For the avoidance of doubt any fast short pitched delivery that is called "Wide" under this playing condition, shall also count as one of the allowable short pitched deliveries in that over.

In the event of a bowler bowling more than one short pitched delivery in an over, the Bowler's-end Umpire shall call & signal "No Ball" on each such occasion. After the Bowler's-end Umpire has called & signaled "No Ball", he shall signal "No Ball" to the scorers and then tap the head with the other hand and shall also issue first warning to the bowler for such violation.

If that bowler again violates this Law in the the same innings, second and final warning shall be issued to the bowler.


If that bowler contravenes this Law again in that innings, the Umpire at the Bowler's-end shall call and signal "No Ball" again and also direct the Captain of the fielding team to take the bowler off forthwith and that bowler shall not be allowed to bowl again in that innings.

15. BALL & HELMET:

(a) Balls will be supplied by this Association.

(b) To ensure safety, Batter must wear good quality Helmets. Players & Wicket Keepers will also not be allowed to field in any 'close-in' position without wearing Helmet.
