Sub: Complaint regarding Violation of Rule 66 of the CAB Rules and willful, deliberate and contumacious violation of the order no. 2 dated 1st November, 2025 passed in Case No. 13(OMB) of 2025.

Order No. 4 dated 22nd August, 2026.

Ld. Counsel appearing for the complainant Mr. Arup Kumar Dutta, submits that provision contained in Rule 66 (4), Rule 66(5), Rule 66(6) and Rule 66(7) have been complied with by the CAB. The Undersigned is also informed by him that Rule 66 (1) and Rule 66(2) have been partly complied with by CAB. According to him, direction contained in Rule 66(8) has not yet been carried out by CAB.

It is pointed out by Mr. Sen, Ld. Senior Counsel appearing for the CAB, from the last Order passed by the Undersigned wherein the submission of the representative of CAB was recorded to the effect that the website of the CAB is now being developed and the information in terms of Rule 66 (8) of the said Rule will be displayed only after the website is fully developed.

Ld. Counsel appearing for the complainant, contended that a date may be fixed within which direction of the Undersigned regarding uploading of the lacking information contained in Rule 66 will be uploaded.

At this juncture, Mr. Sen, Ld. Sr. Counsel of CAB contended that in the very first Order it was indicated that the locus of the complainant which is under challenge, will be considered by the Undersigned. Mr. Sen thus invites the Undersigned to decide the said locus point first.

Accordingly, it is directed that the preliminary dispute with regard to the locus of the complainant to maintain such complaint, will be decided first in the next hearing and in case the complainant succeeds in the said challenge, the merit of the complaint will be considered thereafter.

Hearing of the above proceeding is adjourned till **26th September, 2026 at 6:30 p.m.** Venue will remain the same.

CAB is directed to communicate this order to all concerned, at the earliest.
